PUBLIC SAFETY WEEKLY REPORT

Week Ending 5-6-2018

Rescue Calls

Public Safety responded to eight (8) medical calls this week. Seven (7) calls resulted in the subject being transported.

Barking Dogs/Loose Dog

Public Safety responded to six (6) calls for loose dogs. Five (5) calls resulted in warning's being issued. And one (1) call resulted in a citation being issued.

Public Safety responded to One (1) call for a barking dog. The call was unfounded.

Noise Complaint

Public Safety responded to three (3) calls for noise complaints. One (1) call resulted in a warning being issued. Two (2) calls were unfounded at the time the area was checked.

Reckless Driving

Public Safety responded to the 2000 block of Candlewick Dr for a report of reckless driving and the vehicle almost hitting someone. The offending vehicle was located, and the driver admitted to almost hitting someone a citation was issued and the BCSD was contacted.

Fire Call

Public Safety responded to the 500 block of Lamplighter Loop for a couch outside that had caught on fire. Public safety arrived on scene and extinguished what was left of the fire. The Fire Department arrived and made sure there was nothing else on fire.

Unattended Child

Public Safety responded to the intersection of Galleon Run and Candlewick Dr for a report of a child out unattended. The child was located and returned home and BCSD was notified.

Failure to contain dog and clean up after it

Public Safety responded to the 100 block of Picadilly for a report of a dog not being contained and using the neighbors yard to go to the bathroom. The offending property owner was cited for dog being loose as well as not cleaning up after their pet.

With Spring finally arriving a friendly reminder from the Public Safety Department about mowing.

14-3 Mowing

- A. The lawn on all developed lots (lot with a house on it) must be mowed on a regular basis so as not to allow the grass to be higher than six inches (6").
- B. All vacant lots are required to be mowed four (4) times per year, during the growing season and by the dates published in the Candlewick Lake newspaper.
- C. All lots, both developed or vacant, are to be mowed to the roadway. Grass on developed lots may not be allowed to grow higher than six inches (6"). If the ditch is maintained by natural grasses, which must be approved by the Association, they may not exceed twelve inches (12"). The exception would be any plantings done in conjunction with the Bio-Swale Project. The ditch is defined as the area between the paved road and the lot line.
- D. If there is concrete curbing and/or concrete gutters in front of or on the corner of any developed or vacant lot, the grass must be trimmed around the curbing and/or gutters.
- E. Trimming is required around all trees, mail box posts, sign posts, utility boxes, decorative lot corner markers, decorative rocks, fire and water hydrants and any other structures that are on the lot or in the ditch in front of or on the corner of any lot. This applies to all lots, both developed and vacant.
- F. All vacant lots are to be entirely mowed. Rows (strips) of uncut grass is not acceptable.
- G. If a contractor is hired to mow a developed or vacant lot, it is the responsibility of the owner to be sure the contractor is aware of the mowing requirements.
