Over the years, one progresses through various ranks, learning essential life skills, leadership, and teamwork. To attain the prestigious Eagle rank, he must complete a significant community service project that demonstrates his leadership abilities and commitment to making a positive impact. This journey is a testament to dedication, perseverance, and a strong sense of responsibility, ultimately shaping a young scout into a capable and responsible young adult, ready to tackle life's challenges. Baden-Powell once said "A boy does not really get the full value of scout training until he is a first class scout". He wanted every scout to get the rank of first class and the rest is up to the scout.

My journey started when I was a cub scout at the age of 6 with Pack 77 based at the Outpost in Candlewick Lake. This is where most decide if they want to continue with scouts and get their Eagle Rank. The rank of Eagle Scout is the highest achievement a scout can attain. I decided to continue for a number of reasons. The friendships I've forged along the way have been invaluable, as they have enriched my life with lasting connections and shared experiences that extend far beyond the campfires and meetings. The camping adventures, filled with the thrill of the great outdoors and the serenity of the wilderness, have provided me with a profound appreciation for the environment and the skills needed to thrive in it.

A scout must demonstrate scout spirit, an ideal attitude based upon service, leadership and the scout oath and law. This includes an extensive service project that the scout plans, organizes, and leads. For my project I planned and

built an agility course for dogs in the neighborhood. These courses provides an exciting and beneficial experience for both dogs and their owners. Beyond the physical benefits, participating in agility courses can help improve a dog's confidence and behavior, reducing anxiety and destructive tendencies. It is equipped with a variety of obstacles such as jumps, sea-saws, and bridges. The agility course was designed to challenge your dog's coordination, balance, and problem-solving abilities, making it an excellent way to keep your dogs active and engaged. They offer a dynamic environment that fosters physical and mental stimulation for your dogs. Moreover, these courses promote the development of a strong bond between owners and their fury companions as they work together to navigate the challenges.

Creating a dog park agility course as an Eagle Scout project is not only a remarkable way to give back to my community but also an opportunity to demonstrate my leadership skills and commitment to making a positive impact. With careful planning and dedication I hope to have left a lasting legacy that benefits both dogs and their owners for years to come.




We had never been on a train before so that was an adventure. The Rocky Mountaineer is not a sleeper train, so nightly we stayed in many wonderful hotels.

Information

From the Table - Just a Bite

One of my favorite things is making bread. Who doesn't love the smell of fresh baked bread? mmm! So, when I learned that Belvidere's Library was going to host a lecture and demonstration of breads featured or inspired by literature, I jumped on the opportunity to attend.

The guest speaker was Father Dominic Garramone, a monk of Saint Bede Abby in Peru, Illinois. He was also the host of a PBS cooking show, Breaking Bread with Father Dominic from 1999-2001.

For the library program, he made a variety of yeast and quick breads: Winnie the Pooh Honey Nut Buns, Corn sticks inspired by Little House on the Prairie, Victorian Seed Cakes from books such as Sense and Sensibility and then ended with a Mystery Bread challenge.

We were to eat half a piece of bread and then guess what the mystery ingredient was. Some thought squash, tomatoes or other vegetables...finally someone gave the correct answer... pork and beans! Everyone loved the taste of the Mystery Bread and it was fun trying to guess the mystery ingredient.

The Winnie the Pooh Bun recipe is an easy one to make with young bakers. Father

Dominic had a young girl in the audience help him with this recipe. It begins by warming equal parts of honey and butter together and putting the mixture in a squeeze bottle. According to Father Dominic, make as much of this as you want because this is a great mixture to have on hand not only for this recipe but for cornbread, pancakes or anything you want to sweeten.

Use a regular size muffin tin, squeeze about one tablespoon of the honey/butter mixture into each muffin tin, sprinkle in some chopped pecans or walnuts (nuts are optional) and top each one with a refrigerator roll biscuit. Bake at the temperature on the package just until the tops are lightly browned.

Remove the muffins tin from the oven and lay a plate on top of the muffins. Flip it over so the muffins release onto the plate which allows the honey and nuts to drip down over the sides of the muffin. Father Dominic believes there is no such thing as too much honey butter so he had his assistant drizzle more over the tops of the muffins before she served the warm buns to the audience to enjoy while we listened and learned more about baking breads.

Conversely, I have a friend who has no interest in cooking. She shops at a grocery store where she can make selections from the meat department who will then cook them to her specification and package the finished product for her to take home. Imagine my surprise when she served delicious crusty bread that she made herself!

Personally, I love the work of kneading the dough to a smooth, satiny boule, so it surprised me that she would make her own bread given her dislike for cooking. She assured me that her recipe required no kneading, very little effort and she could even make it gluten free if she wanted to. She gave me the recipe and I agree, it is easy and tasty and can be made with flavor variations as well. Here is my friend's recipe for Crusty Bread and Father Dominic's for Mystery Bread. Enjoy!

Crusty Bread

(The original recipe was from Jim Lahey of Sullivan Street Bakery)

Ingredients:

3 cups unbleached all purpose flour 1 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon instant or rapid rise yeast 1 1/2 cups water

Instructions:

- 1. In a large mixing bowl whisk together the flour, salt and yeast. Add water and mix until a shaggy mixture forms.
- 2. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and let it sit for 12-18 hours at room temperature. Overnight works great.

 After 12-18 hours the dough will look shaggy and be pretty sticky. That's okay, that's the way it is suppose to be.
- 3. Heat oven to 450 degrees F. As soon as the oven reaches 450 degrees place a 5.5 quart Dutch Oven pot with a lid that can take the high heat into the oven. Heat the pot and lid for 30 minutes.
- 4. Right after you put the pot in the oven, Dump the dough onto a heavily floured surface. Put flour on your hands and shape the dough into a ball. (The dough will be VERY sticky) Cover the ball lightly with plastic wrap to keep the dough from drying out while the pot is heating up.
- 5. Use pot holders to remove the hot pot from the oven. Carefully pick up the ball of dough and drop it into the pot. Put the lid back on the pot and return it to the oven to bake for 30 minutes.
- 6. After 30 minutes, remove the lid and continue to bake for an additional 15 minutes.
- 7. Remove pot from the oven and remove bread from the pot to cool on a wire rack.

Variations:

After mixing basic dough, mix in the following ingredients and bake as usual. Lemon, Rosemary and Gruyere cheese: zest of 1 lemon, $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup Gruyere cheese, chopped fresh rosemary to taste.

Cranberry, Orange, Almond: 3/4 cup dried cranberries, zest of 1 orange, 1/2 cup sliced almonds

Sharp Cheddar Cheese: 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup shredded cheddar cheese

Gluten Free: Follow recipe except use gluten free flour (which already contains the correct amount of xanthan gum) in place of regular flour. (Jules Gluten Free flour is recommended for this recipe). They suggest leaving it in the oven 7 minutes longer. It will not rise as much as bread made from normal flour.

Pork & Beans Bread

Ingredients:

- 1 15-16 oz. can of pork & beans
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 cup raisins and/or 1 cup chopped nuts

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Process beans- juice and all in a food processor until smooth. Pour mixture into a large bowl.
- 3. Add sugar, eggs, oil and vanilla extract; mix well.
- 4. Sift together flour, baking powder and cinnamon. Stir into liquid mixture.
- 5. Fold in raisins and or nuts. Do not over mix.
- 6. Divide batter into 2 greased and floured 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"x 2 1/2" loaf pans.
- 7. Bake for 50-60 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.
- 3. Let cool for 10 minutes before removing bread from the pans, and then cool the rest of the way on a wire rack.


