Fishermen: Look at These Electric Motor Options for Your Next Candlewick Craft

If you value quiet, efficient boat operation or a pollution-free option to your gas motor, you may want to check out an array of modern electrically powered marine engines for the upcoming boating season.

Fishermen have long touted the virtues of electric motors. So-called “trolling motors” give fishermen a stealthy way to fish broad flats and long shorelines with their bass boats and other sophisticated fishing craft and offer a low-priced option to a gas engine for row boats and other small craft.

In recent years, however, electric outboard motors have crept into the fishing and boating worlds, setting the stage for what could be a tumultuous shift in propulsion options in the coming years. Torqeedo Inc. (torqeedo.com), a German company with U.S. headquarters in nearby Crystal Lake, Ill., has led this development, both with small lithium battery-powered outboards (1Hp to 25 Hp equivalent) and with 40 to 80 Hp equivalent outboards in its Deep Blue series. The company has also added a high-powered 100 kW Deep Blue 100i inboard motor to its offerings.

Outboard motor giant Mercury Marine announced in February that it, too, was entering the electric outboard field, displaying its Avator Electric outboard concept at the 2022 Miami International Boat Show.

With increasing pressure to diminish usage of fossil-based fuels and reduce carbon emissions, we can expect quiet, environmentally friendly electric motors to proliferate in the coming years. Yet a number of electric outboard motors and integrated electric boat options have gained standing in the boaters’ world already. Here’s a look at a few that you may want to consider for your Candlewick recreation.

Power sources

Electric motors offer distinct advantages. In addition to their quiet, pollution-free operation, electric outboards are cheaper to operate and easier to maintain. Generally, they require only minor maintenance attention and no winterization. Batteries can be charged at little cost.

Market leader for electric outboards is Torqeedo, a German-based company with patented lithium battery technology and, with U.S. operations based in Crystal Lake, Ill., a strong U.S. market presence.

Torqeedo motors appear high and low on the power spectrum.

The company’s earliest market entries were back-up motors for sail boats. Since then, however, Torqeedo’s efficient lithium battery powered motors have gained popularity as primary propulsion units for a broader range of recreational boaters, particularly fishermen. That influence is evident in the recent upgrades and expansions to the company’s Ultralight, Travel (1.5- to 3-HP equivalent) and Cruise (5- to 20-HP equivalent) series motors. Its 1HP Ultralight 403 motor, tailored to kayaks, offers kayak fishermen boat control assistance as well as an alternative propulsion option to paddle or pedal. Torqeedo improved upon its Travel 1003 motor with a new Travel 1103 motor, a more durable model also offering upgrades to the propeller and transom mount design.

All Torqeedo motors provide real-time digital throttle display of speed, input power, range and battery charge. A TorqTrac navigational app for Bluetooth connection links critical motor data to one’s smartphone.

On the other end of the power spectrum, Torqeedo recently showcased a 100 HP addition to its Deep Blue series in Europe that will join Deep Blue’s 40- and 80-HP models.

Ray Electric Outboards, operating out of Cape Coral, Fla., is the oldest U.S.-based electric outboard provider. Its air-cooled motors, ranging from 9.9 HP to 22 HP equivalents, operate on six to 12 golf cart-style wet cell batteries.

Electric trolling motor technology has also enjoyed an

uplift. In 2019, Lowrance and Garmin, two companies known best to anglers for their sonar and GPS units, got into the trolling motor market by introducing highly advanced brushless motors. Both Lowrance’s Ghost and the Garmin Force trolling motors are remarkably silent. They feature wireless hand or foot pedal operation, chart plot integration, autopilot and GPS anchoring features and a transducer that integrates with sonar units.

Off the shelf electric boats

Freedom Electric Marine’s Twin Troller X10 is a compact boat designed for fishing small waters. The X10 is powered by two 45-pound thrust MotorGuide electric motors recessed at mid-point in the hull. Right and left foot pedals activate the motors and control steering, leaving the seated angler completely hands-free.

With a hull made from Surpass resin, the boat is extremely stable. Its easy-to-control foot pedal operation makes it highly maneuverable and responsive. It can move backward or forward or even spin in a circle. A convenient rail system makes installation and removal of its two comfortable seats quite easy.

I’ve fished from a Twin Troller X10 on ponds, rivers, lakes, and even Great Lakes harbors for 12 years. Five seasons ago, I extended its range of operation by adding a custom-made mount



and a Torqeedo Travel 1003 electric outboard. The combination has enabled me to fish significantly larger waters and to fish all day without having to carry a back-up lead battery. With Torqeedo’s 915 lithium battery, the integrated motor/battery combination weighs in at under 32 pounds, adding little to the overall weight of the craft.

Two anglers can fish comfortably from the 10-foot Twin Troller, but if you carry a heavy arsenal of bass tackle like I do, you will find it most effective as a one-man craft.

Fishing pontoons with bow-mounted electric motors have become more angler-friendly in recent years. Compact designs like the SunTracker Bass Buggy 16 are ideal candidates for electric outboards. That model, available through the Bass Pro/Cabela’s retail network, is available in

an all-electric “eco-friendly” package, the Sun Tracker Bass Buggy 16 DLX ET, which includes the Torqeedo Cruise 2.0 outboard. At this writing, three Illinois marine dealers are offering this package.

High-powered electric motors are on the near horizon, too. Canadian Electric Boat Company offers a variety of all-electric recreational boats and outboards, including a 180 HP equivalent motor that operates on a 70 KWH lithium battery. Torqeedo plans to bring higher powered outboards and inboard motors to the U.S. market soon as well.

Check with your local marine dealers for all-electric boat options. Many offer, or will arrange, boat/electric outboard combinations pre-selected by manufacturer or customized to request.

The latest electric marine motors are amazingly quiet and efficient and their operational effectiveness is improving all the time. And with our ever urgent desire for cleaner air and a cleaner Candlewick Lake, expect them to play a greater role in our future water recreation.

Watercraft Registration & Renewals Email documents to cwl@candlewicklake.org

Boats & Personal Watercraft (Jet-skis/Waverunners)

Mail, email, or drop off your current registration, proof of \$100,000.00 liability insurance, and the completed watercraft registration form and a new decal will be issued.

Maximum boat length is 20' and there is a 90 HP limit on all motors operating on the lake.

There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2021 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.

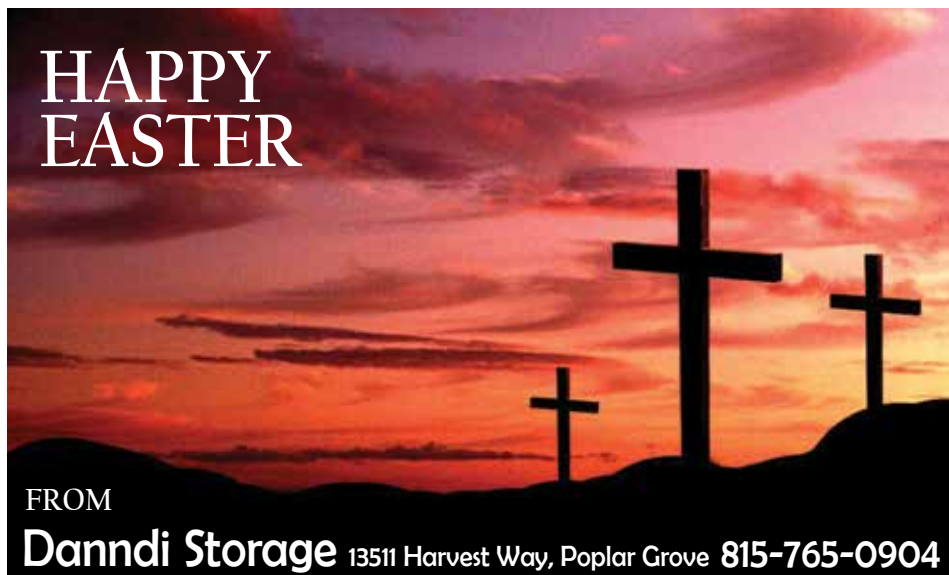

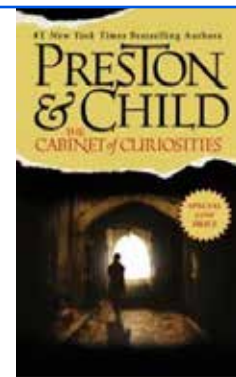

Information

From the Table - Just a Bite

Spring has sprung, and I am ready to refresh and renew after this crazy winter weather. This month I have two recipes to share.

The first is a tempting French pastry that is deliciously simple to make using grocery store ingredients.

Apricot and Almond Jalouse

Serves 4

A Jalouse is a traditional slatted puff pastry filled with fruit, the essence of French cooking you can make at home.

Ingredients:

- 1 sheet of readymade puff pastry
- A little beaten egg
- 6-8 tablespoons apricot preserves (or fruit preserve of your choice.)
- 2 tablespoons of sugar
- 2 tablespoons of sliced almonds

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees f. Roll out the pastry on lightly floured surface and roll into a 12" square. Cut in half to make 2 rectangles.
2. Place one piece of pastry on a parchment lined baking sheet. Brush the beaten egg, just around the edges of the dough. Spread the apricot preserves in the center of the dough, up to the egg wash.
3. Fold the remaining rectangle in half lengthwise and cut about 8 diagonal slits from the center fold to within 1/2 inch of the edge.
4. Unfold the pastry and place it on top of the preserve-covered pastry on the baking sheet, matching each edge carefully to the base. Press the pastry edges together well to seal using a spoon, back of a small knife or fork tines.
5. Brush the slashed pastry top with a little water and sprinkle evenly with the sliced almonds and the sugar.
6. Bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes until well risen and golden brown. Remove the Jalouse from the oven and allow to cool on a wire rack. Serve Jalouse sliced, with cream, yogurt or plain.



With a nod to Candlewick Lake History, the second recipe is a Heritage recipe which was the first recipe shared with homeowners in the February 1977 edition of the CWL newspaper and is as good in 2022 as it was in 1977.

Recipe for a Happy Day

Serves many


Ingredients:

- 1 cup friendly words
- 2 heaping cups understanding
- 4 heaping teaspoons time and patience
- Pinch of warm personality
- Dash of humor

Instructions for Mixing:

1. Measure words carefully, add heaping cups of understanding.
2. Use generous amounts of time and patience.
3. Cook with gas on front burner. Keep temperature low- Do Not Boil!
4. Add a dash of humor and a pinch of warm personality.
5. Season to taste with Spice of Life.
6. Serve in individual molds.

2022-23 CWL Fishing Regulations

- A State Fishing license is required for all persons age 16 and over.
- Your Candlewick Lake Member ID is your Candlewick fishing permit. You need to carry this with you while you are fishing on the lake.
- A guest fishing pass is required for each guest over age 16. It may be a non-designated seasonal or a one day, both can be purchased at the Administration office or at the Recreation Center. Guest passes must be purchased by resident with proof of residency.
- Guest use of the lake is permitted provided that the property owner is on or within the immediate vicinity of the lake at all times. The immediate vicinity is defined as the shoreline or a property owner's lakefront property. Exceptions will be made when there are extenuating circumstances, predetermined by Public Safety that would prevent a property owner from being with their guest. The property owner is responsible for contacting Public Safety, in advance, so that the request may be considered and logged. The log will be maintained so that an individual that has an "approved situation" will not have to call Public Safety every time their guest wants to use the lake. If Public Safety Staff members or certified volunteers see any pattern of abuse to this rule exception, it will result in a withdrawal of the exception privilege for the remainder of the season/year. When there are extenuating circumstances that prohibit the property owner from being on or within the immediate vicinity of the lake, the property owner must still be within Candlewick Lake. (Policy 09-11)
- No Minnows allowed (dead or alive). All other live bait are prohibited also. Exception: Perch and bluegill caught at Candlewick, worms, leeches and dead smelt may be used. **Bluegill & Perch being used as bait may only be collected with hook & line. Netting of fish is not allowed.**

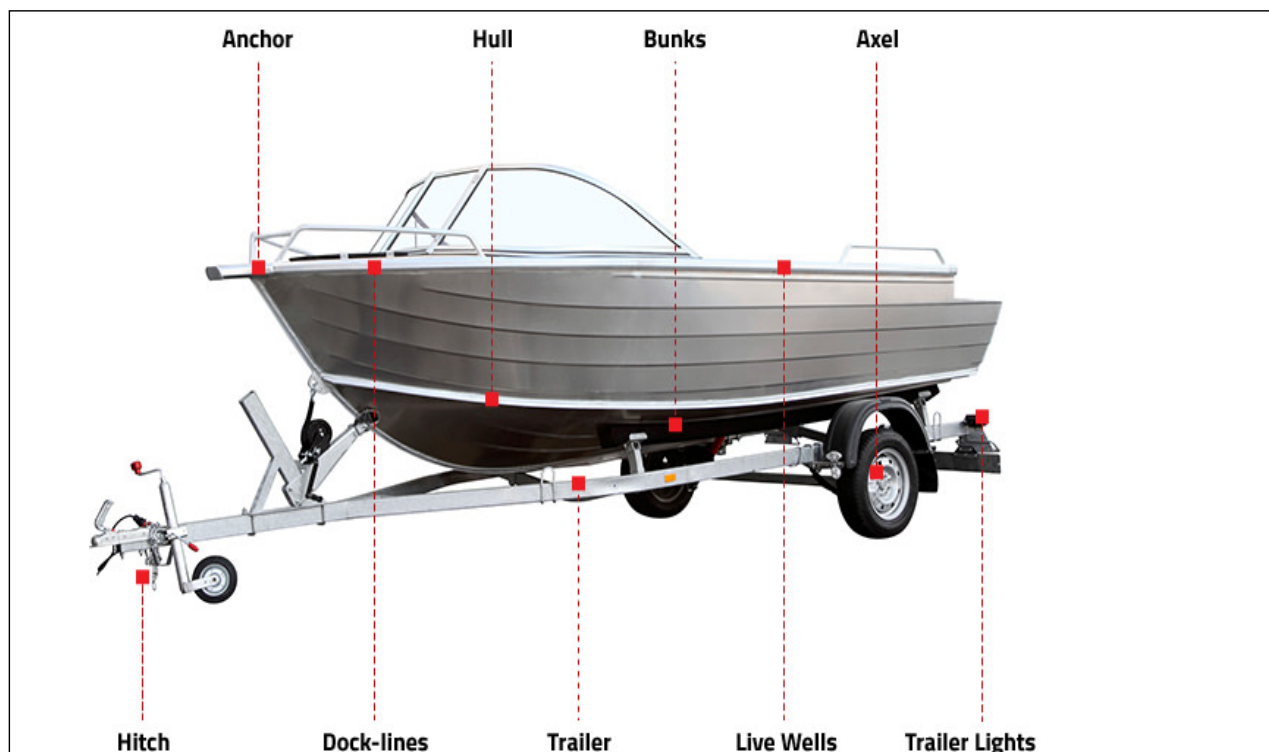
