You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.

"Grabbing the mic and singing that first song to an audience is a tremendous thrill," says Mike Pehanich, Mic Night DJ. "Overcoming those initial jitters is part of the rush. But after that, the excitement and satisfaction only grow!"

Karaoke is a chance to feel the crowd, challenge your vocal chords, be a part of the music in a way that only a live performer can realize. "Hearing your voice resonating from a speaker with band accompaniment takes you by surprise at first," says Pehanich. "But you adjust quickly, and, more often than not, you find yourself fine-tuning your voice and gaining confidence along the way."







About Aqua Aid.

Aqua Aid is an assistance program designed to enable customers in need to receive uninterrupted water service. The program is focused on customers within the communities Aqua serves and is funded by donations from Aqua customers like you. When a customer calls Aqua to request assistance on a delinquent account, they are prescreened for eligibility and referred to a Salvation Army office that facilitates the program. The Salvation Army provides an application to the customer and conducts an interview to determine if the customer qualifies for assistance under the Aqua Aid program. Upon approval, credits are applied electronically to the customer's account.

From the Table - Just a Bite

In my quest to purge some of my cookbooks, I thought a safe place to start was with books about barbecuing. After all, it is almost Christmas!

As I paged through the first book, I kept seeing interesting articles and recipes. After about a dozen pages, I thought I should mark the "good ones" to determine if this book would be a keeper or not.

My sister suggested that if there were only a few pages to keep -"Just make copies of them and get rid of the book." When I showed her the book with dozens of page markers attached, she said ... "Never mind."

Ok, ok, ok... I know it's late in the season for cooking out of doors, but as the author of this book points out, "The view of barbecuing has been blurred over the years. There are many ways to barbecue and a very few set rules (most of which involve internal meat temperatures). EVERYTHING else is up for discussion" including... being only a warm weather activity.

Many cooking methods fall under the term barbecuing:

Grilling- Which is what most people do when they "barbecue": They season, baste and cook foods over direct high heat.

Smoking- (Indirect Cooking) - This is when the heat source is kept away from the food being cooked or smoked.

Pit Cooking- involves cooking food in a pit dug into the ground and heated with hot stones or embers.

Broiling- Using intense high heat from above.

Searing- Blasting high intense heat for a short time to brown meat.

Traditional Barbecue- Slow, low heat cooking; taking a tough cut of meat and through the use of rubs, marinades, sauces, smoking and time, transforming it into something succulent.

Whether you are cooking outdoors or indoors, no matter what cooking method you use, they all can benefit from marinating the meat.

Marinades are used to tenderize and flavor meat. The acids in marinades break down the tissue and the oil carries the flavor of the spices through the meat. Tough meats may need additional help. Using a tenderizing tool or adding yogurt or pineapple juice to your marinade can provide that help. It may take 3 hours or more to break down fibers in pork or beef; chicken requires only about an hour and fish about 30 minutes.

A bottle of salad dressing can be used in a pinch as a marinade. Creamy dressings are good for chicken or fish, while those with oil and vinegar are better for pork and beef. You can also turn your favorite seasoning or rub into a marinade by adding a liquid like citrus juice or vinegar to it.

NOW, is everyone ready to fire up that grill again? Here are a few recipes to try

Kent's Basic Rub

Ingredients:

4 tbsp. freshly ground black pepper

2 tsp. salt 2 tsp. chili powder 4 tbsp. paprika

2 tbsp. garlic powder



Directions:

Combine all the ingredients. Rub thoroughly into the meat before cooking

Butter Barbecue Sauce

This sauce is good for basting, topping, finishing or dipping.

Ingredients:

1 cup melted butter 1 tsp. hot sauce (or to taste)

1/4 cup water 2 tsp. sugar 1 tsp. salt

2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce 1 tbsp. lemon juice 1 tsp. flour

Directions:

Mix all ingredients and bring to a boil in a saucepan; let it cool. If needed add a bit more flour to thicken.

*This sauce is also good for dipping chicken, French Fries and such.

Couch Potato Barbecue Pork Ingredients:

1-4 lb. pork roast

1/4 cup mustard

1 cup beef broth

1 tbsp. apple cider vinegar

1/3 cup hot pepper sauce (or to taste)

1/3 cup Worcestershire sauce

1 cup ketchup

1/2 cup molasses or syrup







1/4 cup chopped onions 1 tsp. garlic powder

1 tsp. crushed red pepper (or to taste)

1 tsp. lemon juice

Directions:

- 1. Place the roast in a slow cooker. Combine, beef broth, hot pepper sauce and Worcestershire sauce, then pour it over the pork. Cover and cook for 5 hours on high. Check every hour and spoon the juice over the meat. (You may need to turn the meat over.) Cook to an internal temperature of 200 degrees f.
- For the sauce- combine the remaining ingredients in a large saucepan and simmer for 10 minutes.
- Place cooked pork roast on a cutting board. (Make sure to keep ½ cup of juice from the slow cooker.)


Chop or "pull" the pork, mix with the sauce and add the ½ cup of juice from the slow cooker; simmer 10 min more.

Serve hot with Texas toast or burger buns. ENJOY your Barbecue indoors and just watch that snow tumble down...
