There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2021 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.


The bins marked for can collection are for CANS ONLY.



From the Table - Just a Bite

Onions-Food for Thought

Onions have always played an important role in my family's diet. So important in fact, that my sister and I made a pact that any men in our lives would meet certain criteria; one of which is that they must like onions!

Onions and food have a natural affinity in my world. It is amazing how the heat of a raw sliced onion transforms into sweet caramelized perfection in a sauté pan. How the types of onions one may use and the manner in which one may manipulate them, provide a rainbow of colors, flavors and textures,

I have to say that while I really never embraced my father's love of a raw onion sandwich, his belief that you can never have too many onions in a good chili was not lost on me!

Onions have a long rich history and played many varied and important roles through the centuries and in countless cultures throughout the world. They have not only offered sustenance, but have been used for medicinal purposes, as religious and political symbols, used in burials, given as gifts, used as payment and been the subject of prose and poetry. They have also been the subject of mystery, myth, superstition, and assorted facts and foibles. (More about this in next month's article)

Onions, shallots, garlic, leeks and chives all belong to the same family of plants - the Alliums. They were first documented as being cultivated in Egypt beginning 3200 BC. They believed that onions, like garlic, provided strength and stamina and prevented illness. According to historians, the Egyptians spent nine tons of gold to pay for all the onions and garlic used to feed the thousands of slaves who built the Great Pyramids. Onion images were depicted on the walls of many pyramids and found in the hands of King Tut, when his tomb was unearthed. They were also used in the burial of Ramses IV, placed in his eye sockets. The belief was that the strong scent of onions would bring breath back to the dead.

Onions as well as other plants, spices and food products found their way through Europe and the Mediterranean, introduced by expanding nations and explorers. Ultimately, onions were introduced to the Americas by Christopher Columbus. Wild and cultivated onions now grow throughout the world. In the United States, they can be found in every state.

Globally, onions are the second most important crop. There are over 600 species of Allium. Onions are available fresh, frozen, pickled and dehydrated. They are eaten raw, cooked, roasted and stewed. They can be sliced, chopped, and minced. As an herb, they may be dried, granulated, powdered, toasted and flaked or made into a paste with other seasonings. For those who don't like the appearance or texture of onions but still wish to experience the flavor and/or health benefits - onion juice is available.

The flavor of onions may be sharp, spicy, tangy, pungent, mild or sweet, depending on the variety and how it is used. Onions are used in cooked dishes more often than they are used raw. Many savory dishes begin with sweating or caramelizing onions. In this form, they may become the base for many sauces, gravies and soups. The slow heating of the onions sweetens and mellows their flavor.

Onions can be used as ornamentals, medicines or other remedies, but for me I simply love to use them as vegetables or condiments to tempt and tease the palate.

Although there are countless ways to use onions, one of the simplest and most satisfying ways to me, is Onion Soup. It can be humble fare or dressed up to suit the occasion or taste buds.

The recipe I present here is simple. I adjust it based on the members of the onion

family that may be on hand. I jotted it down years ago and it has become a staple in our home for a quick and easy meal.

Five Onion Soup

Serves 4

Ingredients:

1/4 cup butter

- 3 shallots (about 3 ounces) finely sliced
- 1 small yellow onion (about 5 ounces) thinly sliced
- 1 small red onion thinly sliced
- 2 green onions, chopped
- 1 leek (light green and white parts only) chopped
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves
- 4 cups beef broth
- 2/3 cup dry sherry

Instructions:

- 1. Melt butter in a large heavy duty Dutch oven over medium heat
- 2. Add shallot, all onions and leek. Sauté until golden
- 3. Add the minced garlic and the cloves
- 4. Stir in the broth and sherry. Bring to a boil, and then reduce heat to medium low. Cover and simmer 30 minutes.

Serve as is or continue with variation below.

Variation: Baked Onion Soup

Use only oven safe bowls that can withstand high heat temperatures for variation

Additional ingredients- for topping

- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 4 slices of French bread
- ½ cup grated fresh Parmesan cheese 4 slices Swiss cheese
- 4 slices Mozzarella cheese

Instructions:

1. Be sure the onion soup is at a simmer

- 2. Preheat broiler. Combine 2 tablespoons of melted butter with 1 teaspoon of minced garlic in a small bowl. Place bread on a baking sheet and brush 1 side of the bread with the garlic butter mixture. Broil bread until lightly toasted. (About 2 minutes). Turn bread over and repeat the process. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.
- 3. Heat oven to 500 degrees f. Place bowls on baking sheet. Ladle soup into bowls. Top each bowl with one of the toasted bread slices. Place 1slice Swiss cheese and 1 slice of Mozzarella cheese on top of each toast piece. Bake soup in hot oven until cheese meltsabout 10 minutes

Bowls will be VERY HOT- handle with care- we serve on hot pads Mmm Mmm Good!



CWL Dog Park Rules & Regulations

1. Purpose: The Candlewick Lake Dog Park (the "Dog Park"), as identified by the Board, has been developed to give Members a place where the dogs of Residents can run free. For everyone's safety and enjoyment, you and your dog(s) are required to adhere to the following rules and regulations while visiting the Dog Park.

- 2. Rules and Regulations:
 - 2.1 Use of the Dog Park is prohibited unless the Resident using the Dog Park has purchased the required tag (the "Tag").
 - 2.2 To obtain a dog park tag, all dogs must have proof of a current up-to-date rabies tag. It is recommended that dogs be current on all their shots; especially kennel cough, distemper, paro virus and a yearly fecal exam.
 - 2.3 Residents will pay \$10/dog/year for a Tag. Fees are based on a fiscal year (May 1-April 30), and not when the Tag is purchased. There will be a \$5 replacement fee for lost tags.
 - 2.4 Residents purchasing tags must read the Dog Park Rules and Regulations (collectively the "Dog Park Rules") and agree in writing that they understand and assume all responsibility for the risk associated with using this facility.
 - 2.5 Tags may be revoked and/or fines charged for non-adherence to the Dog Park Rules, and/or if the Resident is not in good standing with the
 - 2.6 The Dog Park is divided into two areas: one area is for dogs weighing 25 lbs and under; and the other area is for all dogs.
 - 2.7 Dog park hours are from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. or dusk, whichever is later. Public Safety will lock and unlock the Dog Park daily. The Association reserves the right to change, at any time, the times and days the Dog Park is open.
- 3. Usage Rules:
- 3.1 Use of the Dog Park is restricted only to members and their dogs that have been issued proper, valid, and current Tags. Use of the Dog Park by those that do not have a current Tag is prohibited, although more than one person may be present for each dog.
- 3.2 Uses of the Dog Park for anything other than personal/residential use of the Dog Park with a dog with a valid Tag is prohibited, including but not limited to dog training classes, solicitation of dogs, and other similar uses.
- 3.3 Dogs must be under control and in the sight of the user at all times. The user shall be and remain responsible for the behavior of the user's dog(s).
- 3.4 If a user's dog is aggressive, the user must leash the dog. Said leash shall not exceed seven feet in length. The user agrees that the user will address any aggressive behavior before it escalates. If the dog is still aggressive after reasonable steps have been timely taken, the user agrees to remove the user's dog(s) promptly. If aggressive dog owner refuses to remove aggressive dog it is the right of other dog owners to call Public Safety. Public Safety will use their discretion to rectify the situation.
- 3.5 Candlewick Lake reserves the right, at any time, with or without written notice, to refuse to issue. and/or revoke the Tags of dogs displaying aggression or intimidating behavior towards other dogs or people. No refunds will be given for revoked Tags. Candlewick Lake **Rec Manager is** hereby empowered to make these decisions in their discretion.
- 3.6 Registration and rabies tags must be worn on all dog collars and visible at all times when using the
- 3.7 In the event of a dog bite or other injury, each user who is involved, either on their own or through their dog(s), shall exchange Tag and other reasonably-required information such as a name, telephone number, and address.
- By their use of the Dog Park, users stipulate and agree that they know and understand that not all dogs like other dogs. Users agree to research methods to help understand dog behavior and socialization as needed. Users also acknowledge by their use of the Dog Park that some dogs

- growl when they play with other dogs, and thus just because one dog is growling does not mean that it is necessarily being aggressive.
- 3.9 Absolutely no food is allowed to be brought into the Dog Park, including but not limited to dog treats. All dogs have great sniffers and can become aggressive **even** when food is in a pocket.
- 3.10 The maximum number of dogs that any one user may bring to the Dog Park at the same time is four.
- 3.11 Users must carry a leash and a cleanup bag at all times when using the Dog Park. Users are required to immediately pick up after their dog(s). All dog waste must be disposed of properly in onsite refuse containers if available. If such containers are not onsite and able to be used, the user shall dispose of the waste in a proper manner offsite, for it shall not be an excuse that the Association containers are not onsite and able to be used. Users are encouraged to clean up the waste of others if they see one to help keep the area clean.
- 3.12 All objects used for dogs such as tennis balls, frisbees, and other dog toys must be removed when leaving the Dog Park. The Association reserves the right to discard any such objects left at the Dog Park.
- 3.13 Users must be 16 years of age or older. Users between the ages of 11 and 15 must be accompanied by an adult. Children age 10 and under are not allowed at the Dog Park. Users hereby acknowledge, by their use of the Dog Park, that the restriction of Children age 10 and under is for their own protection.
- 3.14 Male dogs must be neutered. Female dogs in heat are not allowed inside the Dog Park. No dogs under 6 months of age are allowed.
- 3.15 Smoking and/or consumption of alcohol beverages are both strictly prohibited.
- 3.16 Non-member dogs are not allowed in the Dog Park. Users allowing non-member dogs into the dog park may have their Tags revoked.
- 3.17 Users are discouraged from allowing their dogs from standing at or near the gate as people are trying to enter. Users agree to not enter if another dog is at the gate unattended.
- 4. Additional Provisions:
- 4.1 All users of the Dog Park, by virtue of their use thereof, acknowledge their notice that the Dog Park is not supervised, and that use is at the user's own risk. To the fullest extent allowed by law, users of the Dog Park, by virtue of their use thereof, stipulate and agree that Candlewick Lake Association is not responsible for injury or damage to any user, dog, animal, or other property, and waive any and all claims they may have against Candlewick Lake Association (including employees, officers, directors, and agents thereof) related to the use of the Dog Park.
- 4.2 Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit, alter, or otherwise restrict the applicability of other rules, regulations, and restrictions on pets in Candlewick Lake.
- 4.3 The Association reserves the right to, at any time, amend these Rules and Regulations, close (temporarily and/or permanently) the Dog Park, and impose additional rules and regulations. In such event or events, there shall be no redress or compensation to anyone as a result of such event or events, including but not limited to those persons that have purchased tags.
- 4.4 In the event one or more provisions contained herein is now or in the future violates any applicable rule, regulation, statute, law, or other applicable provision of the law, said provision(s) shall be automatically amended to the least extent possible to bring said provision(s) into compliance with the law. In the event a person that has been issued a Tag is aware (or believes) that of a provision contained herein violates the law, it is the responsibility of said person to timely notify the Association of such knowledge or belief as a pre-condition to any request for redress due to such actual or alleged violation.
