Meet FLAME, Our New Resident on Candlewick Lake Photos & article by Debby Hruby, Candlewick Drive

At the very end of November, we noticed this visitor swimming across our cove, alongside a few geese. We could not tell from the distance exactly what type of fowl it was, but it was obviously much larger than the geese, so we considered it might be a swan or a snow goose. Several days later, I was out in my kayak, and I came upon the bird feeding along the shore. It was totally unconcerned with my presence, so I was able to get close enough to get a photo which we could use to research in our Audubon Field Guide.

This is a juvenile Trumpeter Swan, which we can guess is 1.5 -2 years old, due to the gray feathers it still shows on its back.

Several days later, there was some concern by residents that the swan might be in distress, possibly trapped in the ice we had at the time, and might need assistance. I contacted Hoo Haven Wildlife Rescue and did some online research. The first thing I learned was that it is very unlikely for a swan to become trapped in the ice, and rescue attempts were not appropriate at that time. Shortly thereafter, the swan got to its feet and wandered away on the ice.

I saw the swan swimming along our shoreline and walking on the ice for the next couple of days, so I decided to give it a name (as we have named many of our local wildlife residents). Considering how athome it seems to be on Candlewick Lake, I felt that Flame was an appropriate name for this beauty.

My most recent encounter with Flame was January 10, when I was kayaking and found Flame all tucked in for a nap on shore. Weather conditions being VERY wintery at this time, I do not know how soon I may spot Flame again, but will be on the lookout as the lake becomes acessible.

Here are a few of the surprising and fun things I have learned about Trumpeter Swans since Flame arrived.

It is not unusual for a juvenile Trumpeter Swan to be alone. They leave their family at a young age and may form a pair bond and nest at the age of 3, but most do not nest until 4-7 years of age. It is impossible to visually tell the sex of a swan, however if Flame forms a bond, there are certain behaviors displayed that will enable us to recognize them as male or female.

Their wintertime habitat includes areas of Minnesota and other upper midwest states. The have a gland that produces oil with which they waterproof their feathers and they have a 2 inch layer of down which can help sustain them in temperatures at -20 degrees and even colder.

In wintertime, they will feed in open water and can reach up to 4 feet below the surface for plants. If the lake freezes over, they can come ashore to graze: however, it is true that most swans do better in the winter if they can keep their feet in open water and have access to lake plants. Access to open water also provides protection from predators. We are fortunate to have an area of open water near the dam that provides that important factor in providing Flame with food and safety.

With the probability that the lake may finally freeze mostly over (as of this article date of January 14), some of us may be lucky enough to see Flame while we are out playing, skiing or fishing on the frozen lake. As long Flame's behavior is not unusual and (s) he is not in obvious distress, Flame does not require any assistance, any food or warm articles "for a bed". Please be respectful of how nature intends for this lovely creature to live its life.

Our very own Trumpeter Swan has done well on its own so far, and I am hoping it finds Candlewick Lake enough to its liking to remain as a permanent resident.







From the Table - Just a Bite

For such a short month, February has a long list of holidays and national days to celebrate: American Heart Month, Black History Month, President's Day, Groundhog Day, Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day, Mardi Gras, The Super Bowl, Leap Year, The Discovery of Pluto, Girl Scout Cookie season; the list goes on...

I decided that a recipe or two for brownies would be perfect for this month. Brownies go with everything. After all, it's CHOCOLATE! And who doesn't like chocolate. I don't want to hear it if you don't like chocolate. My hands are over my

Anyway, did you know that brownies were first created in Chicago? Yep! In 1893, the organizers of the Columbian Exposition approached Bertha Palmer, wife of the owner of the Palmer House Hotel in Chicago. They asked if their chef could create what they called "a ladies dessert that would fit into a boxed lunch," to be sold at the Exposition. They came up with a small cakelike confection made of chocolate and walnuts with an apricot glaze. This is considered the birth of the brownie, although it wasn't given that name until around 1896.

The first example of the "modern" type brownie was created in 1904, and since then there have been a multitude of variations. Some prefer a tender cake-like consistency, while others, a more fudgy/chewy bite. Some recipes include any number of add-ins such as nuts, chips, caramels or topped with icing or ganache. Here is one I hope you will enjoy.

Cappuccino Brownies

A coffee-with-cream layer separates two super-rich layers.

Ingredients

1/2 cup butter or margarine

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

3 ounces unsweetened chocolate, chopped

1 teaspoon instant coffee crystals

1 cup granulated sugar

1 tablespoon of whipping cream

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla

2/3 cup all purpose flour **Chocolate frosting Ingredients**

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

1/3 whipping cream

1 cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces

Instructions: 1. Melt the 1/2 cup butter or margarine and unsweetened chocolate in a medium

- saucepan over low heat, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; cool slightly. Stir in granulated sugar.
- Add eggs, one at a time, beating with a wooden spoon just until combined.
- Stir in vanilla.
- Stir together the flour and baking soda in a small bowl.
- Add flour mixture to chocolate mixture and stir just till combined.
- Spread batter in a greased 8x8x2 inch baking pan.
- Bake in a 350 degree f preheated oven for 30 minutes.

Meanwhile for topping: Dissolve coffee crystals in whipping cream. Beat together the powdered sugar and the 2 tablespoons of butter or margarine in a small mixing bowl with an electric mixer on medium speed. Add whipping cream mixture and beat until creamy. If necessary, add a little additional whipping cream to the mixture until mixture is spreading consistency. After brownies have been removed from the oven, let cool a bit. Then spread the cream mixture over warm brownies. Chill about 1 hour or until topping is set.

Chocolate Frosting: Combine the semi-sweet chocolate pieces and whipping cream in a small saucepan. Stir over low heat till chocolate is melted and mixture begins to thicken. Cool briefly and carefully spread chocolate frosting over brownies. Chill until frosting is set. Cut into bars- makes 16

OK, ok, ok I guess there might be one or two people who don't like chocolate, so for those (misguided though they may be) here is a recipe for Blondies - enjoy!

Classic Blondies

Ingredients

1/2 cup butter, melted

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 cup packed dark brown sugar

1/8 teaspoon baking soda

1 large egg, lightly beaten

Pinch salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup all-purpose flour


1/3 - 1 cup mix-ins such as butterscotch chips chopped nuts etc.

Instructions

- Preheat the oven to 350°F
- Lightly butter and flour an 8x8-inch pan.
- Whisk together the melted butter and sugar in a bowl. Add the egg and vanilla extract and whisk to combine.
- Add the flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt, and mix it all together. Add the butterscotch chips or other mix-ins (up to 1 cup total).
- Pour into the pan and spread evenly. Bake for 18 to 25 minutes or until a tester inserted into the center comes out clean.
- Allow to cool. Cut into squares or rectangles and serve.


