Have You Seen the Bald Eagles at Candlewick Lake?

Information from American Eagle Foundation & Illinois DNR

We have some beautiful residents here at Candlewick. Have you seen them lately? Bald eagles live almost exclusively around water—lakes, rivers, ponds, oceans—in North America: all around the United States, except Hawaii, and throughout most of Canada. They live in dramatic temperature extremes, from hot deserts of Arizona and the heat of Florida and the Southern United States, to near the tree line in extreme northern Canada and Alaska. The Missouri and Illinois river areas host the second largest wintering population of bald eagles in the lower 48 states. Did you know that Illinois boasts the largest population of wintering bald eagles outside of Alaska? We are privileged to host these birds through winter at our lake.

The Bald Eagle Population Size Report: 2020 Update provides the most current population estimate of bald eagles in the lower 48 states. The bald eagle population climbed to an estimated 316,700 individual bald eagles, including 71,400 nesting pairs. This estimate indicates that the bald eagle population has quadrupled since the last set of data was collected in 2009.

Fish comprise about 70 to 90 percent of the diet of bald eagles. However, they are opportunist feeders, meaning they will feed on what is most available, and requiring the least amount of energy to acquire it. For example, bald eagles will often follow the fall migration of ducks and geese and feed on birds that have been injured by hunters. They also can feed on moderately sized wild mammals, such as ground hogs. Eagles consume one to two pounds of food each day.

Bald eagles usually establish a territory where they will nest with a mate; however, wintering birds do not establish a territory, but usually do use the same area each winter.

These majestic birds are so special, that they are protected by federal law. The Bald Eagle will continue to be protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act even though it has been delisted under the Endangered Species Act. Bald eagles are recently recovered from endangered species status. Humans are the main reason for bald eagle deaths in Illinois, either directly (shooting, poisoning, trapping) or indirectly (vehicle strikes, hitting power lines, electrocution).

This law, originally passed in 1940, provides for the protection of the Bald Eagle and the Golden Eagle (as amended in 1962) by prohibiting the take, possession, sale, purchase, barter, offer to sell, purchase or barter, transport, export or import, of any Bald or Golden eagle, alive or dead, including any part, nest, or egg, unless allowed by permit Bald Eagle sitting in tree (16 U.S.C. 668(a); 50 CFR 22).



"Take" includes pursue, shoot, shoot at, poison, wound, kill, capture, trap, collect, molest or disturb (16 U.S.C. 668c; 50 CFR 22.3).

According to the Illinois DNR, January and February are ideal months for viewing bald eagles in Illinois. Did you know that the fourth Saturday in January each year is Illinois Eagle Day? Eagle Day celebrates the American Bald Eagle, the official national emblem of the United States and the living symbol of our nation's freedom, spirit and strength. Watch those skies, especially during this month, and you may see some of our beautiful visitors! They think our fishing is pretty good too!







Winter weather is upon us - Be Prepared!

The Public Safety Commission would like to recommend putting together a Car Emergency Kit.

The average American spends 17,600 minutes driving each year, and for those of us living in the northern part of the country, a lot of those minutes are spent driving in hazardous conditions that include wind-driven snow, poor visibility, and icy road conditions. We need to be prepared for breakdowns.

Items that should be included in your car's emergency kit are listed below and should be considered the minimum necessary to carry you and your family through an emergency.

- Durable bags or crates to store your supplies
- First aid kit
- Small fire extinguisher
- Jumper cables
- Flashlight(s) and extra batteries
- Some basic tools a wrench, pliers, a multipurpose tool.
- Ice scraper
- · Rain ponchos
- Plastic tarp
- Blankets and warm clothing
- Bottled water and a small supply of non-perishable food
- Local maps
- Rags and duct tape
- Automotive fluids such as oil, transmission fluid, and anti-freeze
- Cat litter for icy, slick roads
- Good spare tire and a jack and tools for changing a tire
- Road flares or caution reflectors
- Empty but refillable gas can
- And if possible, emergency cash for gas and a cell phone charger cable.
- Finally, remember to include those items unique to your family's needs such as baby supplies, pet necessities, and/or important medications.

BOAT STORAGE

This is a reminder of the rules that state for improved lots any recreational vehicle parked on the property <u>must</u> <u>be registered to the owner or resident of the property and are limited to three items</u>. For unimproved lots only watercraft with or without the trailer are allowed to be parked on unimproved lots. No more than three watercraft may be parked on the lot and must be behind the front setback line. <u>All watercraft must be registered to the owner of the lot.</u>

Amenity Usage

The Rules and Regulations state that a Candlewick Lake Photo ID Membership Card (Member Card) or app are required for use of the amenities (pool, golf course, fitness center, gymnasium, and boating and fishing facilities). The rules further state that any Member that is not in good standing shall have their Membership Card privileges suspended until said Member rectifies his/her membership standing. This includes the privileges for all registered Members. The rules do not say that a Member can't pay the daily fee for use of the amenities. The Board of Directors passed a resolution at the April 21, 2015 Board meeting that any Owner, Associate Members, Tenant, and any other family members who reside in a house will not be allowed to pay the daily fee to use the amenities if their amenity privileges have been suspended. Additionally, any Owner, Associate Members, Tenant, and any other family members who reside in a House and are not in good standing they will not be permitted to rent any of the Candlewick Lake facilities. If any Member is not in good standing Owner, Associate Members, Tenant, and any other family members who reside in a house will also not be allowed to use the Recreation Center or come into the Savannah Oak Clubhouse.

Information

2024-25 CWL Ice Fishing Regulations A State Fishing license is required for all people ages FISH LIMITS FOR RESIDENTS:

- Your CWL Member ID is your Candlewick Lake fishing permit and must be carried with you while fishing on the lake.
- A guest fishing pass is required for each Guest age 16+ and may be a non-designated seasonal or a oneday pass. Both can be purchased at the Administration Office or Recreation Center. Guest passes must be purchased by a Resident with proof of residency.
- Guest use of the lake is permitted provided that the Property Owner is on or within the immediate vicinity of the lake at all times. Immediate vicinity is defined as the shoreline or a Property Owner's lakefront property. Exceptions will be made when there are extenuating circumstances, as predetermined by Public Safety, that would prevent a Property Owner from being with their Guest. The Property Owner is responsible for contacting Public Safety in advance so that the request may be considered and logged. The log will be maintained so that an individual that has an "approved situation" will not need to call Public Safety every time their Guest wants to use the lake. If Public Safety staff members or certified volunteers see any pattern of abuse to this rule exception, it will result in a withdrawal of the exception privilege for the remainder of the season/ year. When there are extenuating circumstances that prohibit the Property Owner from being on or within the immediate vicinity of the lake, the Property Owner must still be within the Candlewick Lake Community. (Policy 09-11)
- All shanties must be marked with the name and address of the CWL Property Owner or Resident and cannot be left on the ice overnight unattended.
- Only two (2) lines per person. This may include: 2 rods, 1 rod and 1 tip up, or 2 tip ups.
- NO MINNOWS ALLOWED (dead or alive). All other live bait is also prohibited. Exceptions: Bluegill and Perch caught at Candlewick, worms, leeches, and dead smelt may be used. Bluegill & Perch being used as bait may only be collected with hook & line. Netting of fish is not allowed.

DID YOU KNOW...

That the money from the cans collected at the three can bins (Castaway, Highland Valley Green, and the Recreation Center Peninsula) is used for funding projects to benefit both the lake and the community. The funds have been used to help pay for fish stocking, building fish structures, purchase of a GPS that is used for lake related issues, lake plantings, waders, laser lights (to chase the geese), and the Kids Fishing Tournament. If you have aluminum cans that you are either throwing away or putting in the recycling bin, please consider bagging them and taking them to one of the can bins located in Candlewick. The Friends of Candlewick have recently voted to use funds from the cans for projects that could either benefit the lake and/or the community. This is expanding the scope beyond specific lake use, and may be used to benefit the entire community where needed.

From the Table - Just a Bite

Hidden Kitchens

One of my first jobs was working at a plant nursery, which also coincided with my first apartment. In those days, many of the labor laws did not apply to agriculture jobs. I earned a whopping \$1.25 per hour; so my food budget was quite tight!

I rented a small attic apartment. My landlords had a large garden and let me use part of it to grow vegetables for myself. Generally, I would buy one container of beef liver, which usually contained enough slices for me to have one a day along with the vegetables from the garden; enough to eat, but pretty boring.

At the nursery, I worked alongside men and women from all over the world: Mexico, South America, France, Germany, Denmark and beyond. I loved working there; the camaraderie, the diverse group of people, learning their cultures and having the opportunity to learn about a variety of foods. There were always new smells, interesting dishes to be tasted and shared by all.

I hadn't thought about this for a long time until I was reading a book called Hidden Kitchens. It contains stories and recipes about food or lack of it and the memories and stories it brings. About clandestine cooking and secret kitchens that were and are everywhere, often where you least expect to find them but exist because of a need in a community or business to feed hungry people, and about how communities come together through food and sharing.

One of the most unexpected stories in the book is about George Foreman and the George Foreman Grill. Of course I had heard of George Foreman and his grill but both had little significance to me. BOXING? I have no interest in watching people beat each other up and never had any interest in the grill. I thought of it as just a way to capitalize on his fame and make some money once his boxing career was over. That is, until I read this book.

Actually, the story starts with the grill and how it has become a "Hidden Kitchen" and come to have an unexpected life of its own. The book talks about a homeless man named Jeffry Newton who lived in a refrigerator box in a cardboard community under Wacker Drive in Chicago and how he jury-rigged a George Forman Grill that was missing its plug to an electrical outlet on one of the many poles down on Wacker Drive by using a long extension cord. He made hamburgers, grilled cheese or bologna sandwiches in his "kitchen on the street" for himself and others in their cardboard community.

When this story was relayed to Foreman along with other stories about people who don't have an "official kitchen" and what the grill has meant to homeless, low income people and the elderly who are often relegated to smaller and smaller spaces without a place to cook, and how his grill had helped so many people, he shared his own story.

Foreman explained, growing up in Houston, he was one of seven children and spent his whole life trying to get enough to eat. They were poorer than poor. He recalled how his mother would come home with a cheeseburger and try to divide it among the seven kids. He remembers it as "the most supreme thing when she would come home with a burger!"

He learned to disguise not having food. He was embarrassed by the lack of it, so he would find a greasy bag, blow air into it on his way to school, to make it look like he had a sandwich in it so no one would know he had no food to eat.

Being hungry all the time had a devastating effect on his perceptions and the choices he made in his life. Many of them bad- like dropping out of school in 10th grade. It all changed one day when, at age 16 he heard his football hero, Jim Brown, talk about the Job Corps, a program initiated by President Lyndon B. Johnson in his War on Poverty in 1964.

Foreman joined the Job Corps. It was the first time in his life he had three meals a dayand that changed everything for him- his outlook on life and the possibilities in his future that would lie ahead as a boxer and yes, as an entrepreneur of the George Foreman grill and more.

He went on to become a Physical Education Teacher at Camp Parks in Oregon, Amateur Boxer and Olympic Gold Medal Winner, Heavy weight Champion of the world...His accomplishments go on and on.

The immense financial success of the grill surprised him, but also allowed him to open youth centers and summer camps where children could have three meals a day and learn and stretch the possibilities in their lives!

What can I say...? I love to learn little nuggets of information like this that give me insight into misconceptions I have had for so long.

So in honor of George Foreman and his Grill, I offer you his recipe for Grilled Salmon

Grilled Salmon Ingredients:

2 (6 ounce) skinless salmon filets 1/8 cup low-sodium soy sauce

1/8 cup water
1/4 tsp garlic powder
Lemon Pepper to taste
Salt to taste

1/8 cup brown sugar 1/8 cup vegetable oil

1/8 cup water 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

Directions:

- 1. Place all ingredients, except salmon filets in a bowl and mix well until sugar is dissolved. Pour mixture into a ziplock bag and add salmon filets. Make sure filets are well coated, squeeze out any air, and refrigerate for at least an hour a couple of hours or even overnight for more flavor.
- 2. Preheat your George Foreman Grill with the lid closed for at least 5 minutes. Use the high setting for the first batch.

 If your grill is a particularly hot one you may need to adjust the temp down, but this is
- 3. Brush a little vegetable oil on the grill to help prevent sticking. Add salmon filets to the grill and close the lid. Grill for about 2-3 minutes. Flip the filets and give them a 1/4 turn. This helps assure even grilling and gives nice grill marks. Continue grilling for approximately 2-3 more minutes. Salmon will flake easily with a fork when done.
- 4. Enjoy this recipe!! You can adjust the amount of lemon pepper and garlic powder to suit your taste.

If you do not have an indoor grill, you can use an outdoor grill using these steps.

1. Grill the salmon for **6-10 minutes**, depending on the thickness. Salmon is cooked to perfection when it flakes apart easily with a fork. It's ok if the middle is a bit pink, that's actually what you want.

You want the center to be 145°(F). To avoid overcooking the salmon and to get that perfect result, pull the salmon off the grill when the internal temp reads *close to* 140°(f), then let it rest on a plate, covered in foil for 5 minutes. The salmon will continue to cook and reach the desired temperature. The results will be awesome. There will be just enough char on the outside with a nice, tender and moist meat that's oh so good.


