

There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2021 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. Guest watercraft are not allowed.

COURSE ETIQUETTE:

For the most part our golfers take very good care of our course. We have had many compliments that Savannah Oaks is in as good or better shape than other courses in the area, so we are working hard to keep it that

Unfortunately, we have had reports of damage to both the greens and fairways, as well as the golf carts. Therefore, we are asking for your help. If you see anyone doing any damage to the course or carts, including irresponsibly handling of the carts, please take a picture and report it to the clubhouse as soon as possible.

Vandalism and improper behavior driving of the carts will not be tolerated. If you are caught doing any damage to the course such as slamming a club into the green, or damaging the fairways by driving the carts erratically, you will be banned from playing golf the rest of the 2022 season.

TIPS TO IMPROVE THE PACE OF PLAY.

In order to have the golf round be enjoyable for all we need to keep up a good pace of play. The tips below are not designed to rush players, but instead to help them be ready play.

- 1. The easiest of all recommendations is to play readygolf. There is no need to debate, particularly when you are in the fairway, who is furthest out. The first person who is ready should hit. That goes for the tee box as well.
- If you aren't hitting, get ready to play. Know where and how far you want to hit the ball when it's your turn swing.
- Don't wait in the cart for you partner. Drop him or her off, go to your ball and get ready for your shot. If you want to leave the cart, that's fine, too, but take a couple clubs and start walking. Nothing wastes more time than sitting in the cart watching someone else
- Play every lost ball as a lateral hazard, assuming you aren't in a tournament stipulating otherwise. Stroke and distance is the worst penalty in the game and it's the nemesis of pace of play. If you must adhere strictly to the rules, hit a provisional if there is any doubt.
- Be aware of how much time you spend looking for balls in the woods. Too many amateurs end up traipsing through the trees in search of a ball that will provide an unplayable lie even if found. Don't be afraid to declare a ball lost. Unfortunately, it's part of the game.
- Fill out the scorecard on the next tee box, not beside the green where you just putted out.
- Take every precaution to avoid walking back to the cart. Keep an extra ball in your pocket if you are in search of one; bring more than one club, particularly if you are chipping and have a variety of choices. Golf is a thinking man's game and using your head before you get to the ball will speed up play.
- Don't mark every putt. If you have a two-footer or something just outside the leather, go ahead and knock the ball in the hole. You shouldn't rush, but conversely, there is no need to slave over every putt as if The Masters is at stake. If one player squanders just 30 seconds per hole, which isn't hard to do, that's nine minutes per round. The reality is the difference between playing in 4:30 and 5 hours isn't as great as some might believe.

One person can back up an entire golf course. Don't be that person!







Information

From the Table - Just a Bite

Farmer's Markets

It's July and farmer's markets are popping up all over- Time to shop for some great fresh foods.

Although Illinois farmers are best known for growing corn and soy beans, they also grow about 80 other varieties of vegetables, fruits and nuts. Crops harvested and sold locally at markets or grocery stores generally provide peak flavor and best prices in season. July is a great time to find an array of fresh fruits and vegetables.

I picked up some information from the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau, which offers a few suggestions to help you select produce at its peak. They recommend "when inspecting fruits and vegetables, ask yourself how items smell, feel and if they look appealing." Fruits & Melons

- Should be smooth and even, with a firm but not rock hard surface.
- Oranges, lemons and melons should feel heavy for their size. The weight can indicate how juicy the fruit or melons are.

Vegetables and Leafy greens

- Should be evenly colored and firm.
- Leafy greens should be firm, crisp with plump leaves.

Root Vegetables (potatoes, garlic, onions)

- Should be firm,
- Cracks on the base side, indicates it is too dry.

Happily, July is a month when you may find nectarines, peaches, plums and apples at the market which is perfect for this month's recipe! It is a batter cake that is very E-A-S-Y to make. All you do is throw some fruit in the bottom of a cake pan, mix up a simple batter, pour it over the fruit and bake.

The fruit caramelizes on the bottom of the pan and the batter browns on top- not unlike a pineapple upside down cake- then you flip it over to serve.

This recipe calls for apples or peaches but I have also made it with nectarines and plums to equal success. The only difference is the baking times when you use plums. Because of the greater juice content - you will need to bake it just a "hair bit" longer.

Apple (Peach or other stone fruit) Batter Cake

Makes 1-9" round cake

Ingredients:

- 12 tablespoons (1 ½ sticks) butter, melted and cooled to room temperature; plus more for smearing in cake pan
- 5 or 6 medium-size apples, peeled, cored and cut into 1/4" slices; or 5 big ripe peaches, peeled and cut into 1/2" wedges
- 1 tbsp. cinnamon
- 1 cup plus 1 tablespoon sugar- divided
- 1 cup un-bleached, all purpose flour
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1 ½ cups walnuts, coarsely chopped

- Position your oven racks so that one is in the center of the oven, and preheat the oven to 350 degrees f. Smear a 9 inch round cake pan with a generous amount of butter.
- Toss the fruit slices with the cinnamon and 1 tablespoon of the sugar. Spread the fruit evenly over the bottom of the cake pan.
- Whisk the remaining sugar and the flour together in a big bowl. Whisk in the egg and melted butter until just a bit of the flour remains visible. Stir in the walnuts, and continue stirring until no flour is visible. Pour the batter evenly over the fruit, using a rubber spatula to get all of the batter into the cake pan. The batter will be thick.
- Place the pan on the center rack in the oven, and bake the cake for 40-45 minutes, or until top is golden brown and a toothpick or small knife inserted into the center comes out clean.
- Remove the pan from the oven, and place on a wire rack. Let the pan sit for a while, until it is cool enough to touch. To remove the cake from the pan, slide a table knife around the edge to loosen the cake, put a serving plate over the top of the pan and quickly flip the pan over. The cake should come right out. Serve and enjoy cake warm or at room temperature.

Note: If part of the cake is still stuck to the cake pan when you flip it over, just remove what stuck and gently patch the missing piece back onto the cake. It will stick in place as it cools a bit longer- no harm, no foul.

If you get there when it opens, you'll get the most variety of produce for the day, but the best deals may come at the end of the day when the crowds are thinning and the farmers may offer deals


- Take cash, especially small bills. Many farmers accept only cash and you don't want to be limited to the vendors with only credit card machines.
- Take easy to carry bags with you or a rolling cart or even your kid's wagon to carry all your fresh purchases.
- If you are buying herbs or greens, get them before the sun warms up. The heat will
- Farmers who sell only a few produce items are more likely to specialize in them, ensuring a better quality.
- Try a few of the specialty items at the market. Farmers put in a lot of love into products like honey and cheese.
- Most farm stands have a second's bin of discounted fruits and vegetables that are bruised or bent but which are perfectly good for your cooking or canning needs.





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
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
