Boats & Personal Watercraft (Jet-skis/Waverunners)

Mail, email, or drop off your current registration, proof of \$100,000.00 liability insurance, and the completed watercraft registration form and a new decal will be issued. Maximum boat length is 20' and there is a 90 HP limit on all motors operating on the

There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2021 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft



#### Pickleball Fun Facts!

Here are a few fun facts (borrowed from the Bayside Fenwick Island Blog) that you may not know about pickle-ball:

- 1. Pickleball is One of the Most Popular Sports in the Country:
  - Today, pickleball is played all over the world—in fact, the USAPA recently estimated that over 400,000 people actively play this addictive game on a regular basis.
- 2. It's Been Around for 50 Years:
  - Pickleball is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year, as it was invented in 1965.
- 3. It All Started With Three Men, a Few Bored Kids and a Dream:
  - Pickleball was first invented by three dads up in Washington state. They created the game as a solution to their children's boredom during the summertime.
- Initially, pickleball paddles were made entirely of wood, however in recent years, lightweight materials like graphite and aluminum have been incorporated to lessen the weight of the paddle. The typical pickleball paddle is larger than a ping-pong paddle, but smaller than a tennis racket.
- Not Your Average Ball:
   Unlike tennis or pingpongping-pong balls, pickleball balls have holes (similar to the holes found in Whiffle
- Slower Than a Speeding Bullet: Due to the inferior aerodynamics of the pickleball ball, (thanks to its large holes), pickleball balls travel

- approximately 1/3 the speed of a tennis ball.
- 7. The Best Picklers Are Never "Pickled": In pickleball, players are referred to as "Picklers", and those who have lost did not "lose", they have "Pickled"
- 8. When in Doubt, Stay Out of The Kitchen: The 7-foot non-volley zone directly in front of the pickleball court's net is called "The Kitchen".
- 9. That's a "Dink" Shot:

  The term "dink shot" is used when a soft shot narrowly arcs over the pickleball net and lands in the Kitchen (also known as the non-volley zone).
- 10. The True "Pickle" Behind Pickleball:
  Pickleball was named after one of the inventors,
  Congressman Joel Pritchard's dog, whose name was
  Pickles.



# From the Table - Just a Bite By S.L. Bartels, Drew Ct.

**Food- Glorious- Food!** 

Food is one of the three essentials for mankind's survival, and according to some historians, mans eating habits have influenced mankind's development.

For example, in Europe in the Middle Ages one's station in life determined what food one was allowed to eat and how it could be prepared.

Laws spelled out in precise detail what people in each class and income level were allowed to eat; and medical practitioners of the time maintained that social inequity by claiming the needs of the manual laborer and those of the leisure class were completely different. Dietary transgressions were punishable by law.

While the diets of the Lords and Ladies consisted of rare and costly foods and spices, the poorer classes consumed coarser foods that were lower in price and lower in social prestige- such as onions and garlic.

After learning this historical fact, I suppose you can guess that I identify more closely with the laboring class, given the fact that in my article last month I stressed the importance of onions in my life and cooking.

I have to think that karma played a hand in the next bit of information I read. Documents confirmed that during the time of the plagues throughout Europe, owners of onion and garlic shops were among the few who seemed to be immune to these deadly

Further, convicts who were released from prison to remove the bodies of those stricken with the plague never contracted the disease. This was attributed to the wine they drank daily, in which garlic and onions had been soaked.

Onions and garlic along with so many of the ingredients we use today in our meal preparations (olive oil, vinegars, nuts, legumes, seeds and spices) originated in ancient times and in the oldest civilizations, the Roman, Greek and Egyptian Empires. And each ingredient has its own unique history as it has made its way through time and continents to American tables.

The recipes this month will take us back to the origins of some of these ingredients. They were provided by Bonnie Marron, who recently returned from a trip to Egypt. These three intriguing recipes give us the opportunity to experience some of the flavors of

One of the recipes is Koshary, Egypt's National dish which is made with garlic, onions and an interesting combination of other ingredients. So if you'll excuse me, I believe this dish is calling me to the kitchen.

I leave you with a quote from a well known playwright...

"My eyes smell onions,

I shall weep anon"

Shakespeare

(See, I told you onions were the subject of poetry and prose.)

This dish is a combination of lentils, macaroni noodles and rice in a single dish that is topped with a spice filled tomato sauce, chick peas and crisp fried onions. It is enjoyed at home, in restaurants and as a favored street food.

#### Koshary

Serves 4 Ingredients

2 tbs. olive oil

1 cup medium grain rice

2 cups vegetable stock

1 cup brown lentils

2 cups water

1 garlic clove, quartered

1 tsp. cumin

1 bay leaf

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups small macaroni noodles

#### Instructions

- 1. Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the rice and fry it for 2 minutes, then add the vegetable stock. Bring it to a boil, decrease the heat to low, cover and simmer for 15 minutes or until the rice is cooked.
- Rinse the lentils under cold water and add them to another medium saucepan with 2 cups of water. Add the garlic, cumin and bay leaf and bring it to a boil. Reduce the heat to low, cover and simmer for 20-30 minutes or until the lentils are tender. Once cooked, add the salt and stir to combine. Strain any excess liquid if necessary.
- Cook the macaroni according to package instructions until al dente.

\*Note: Prepare the rice, macaroni and lentils while the sauce is simmering and leave them covered in the pots to keep warm.

#### For the Sauce:

2 tbsp. olive oil 2 cloves garlic finely minced 2 tsp. baharat spice blend

1 small onion finely diced 1-15 oz can plain tomato sauce Salt & pepper to taste

1 tbsp. red wine vinegar

1/4 teaspoon red chile flakes (omit if you don't like it spicy hot)

#### **Instructions:**

To make sauce: Heat the oil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat and add the onion. Cook until soft and translucent, about 5-7 minutes. Add the garlic and sauté until golden brown. Add the tomato sauce, baharat, salt and pepper, red wine vinegar and chile flakes (if using). Bring it to a simmer, reduce the heat to low, cover and simmer for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally.

#### For Crispy Onion Garnish:

Oil for deep-frying 2 large onions, very finely sliced

1-15ounce can chickpeas (garbanzo beans), rinsed and drained

#### **Instructions:**

To make the crispy onions, heat the oil in a skillet. Add the onions and fry until dark brown. Using a slotted spoon, remove them from the oil and place them on paper towels to drain and cool.

#### To Serve:

Combine the rice, lentils and macaroni in a large bowl and toss to combine (or simply scoop out desired amounts of each onto the plates). Sprinkle a little baharat over each portion and serve topped with some of the spicy tomato sauce. Top with chickpeas, the crispy onions and another sprinkle of baharat. Serve warm.

Baharat - is a Middle Eastern spice blend. If you cannot find it at the store here is how to make your own.

#### **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp. black pepper corns 1 tbsp. cumin seeds 2 tsp. coriander seeds 1 tsp. whole cloves 1/2 tsp. cardamom seeds 1 1/2 tbsp. paprika 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg 1 tsp. ground cinnamon

**Instructions:** 

1. Set aside the paprika, cinnamon and nutmeg for now. Heat a small skillet over medium high heat and dry roast the whole spices/seeds until they become fragrant (3-5 minutes). Toss them regularly to keep them from burning. Take off the heat and allow them to cool completely. Combine all the spices and grind them in a spice or coffee grinder. Store in an airtight container.

#### Babaghanoug Salad (or Baba Ghanoush)

It is usually served as an Appetizer; it can be used as a dip or a spread.

Makes: 2 ½ cups

**Ingredients:** 

1 large eggplant

1/3 cup tahini (sesame paste)

1/4 cup fresh lemon juice

2 cloves garlic, crushed

1 tsp. ground coriander

Salt and black pepper to taste 2-3 tbsp. olive oil (or more, to taste)

**Instructions:** 

Preheat oven to 350 degrees f.

- 1. Prick eggplant with a fork. Place it on a baking sheet and roast until very soft.(About 1 hour) Remove from oven and let cool.
- Cut in half. Scrape insides into a medium size bowl and discard the skin.
- Mash the eggplant with the tahini. Stir in the lemon juice, garlic, coriander, salt and pepper. (The mashing and blending can also be done in a food processor)
- Stir in the olive oil.
- Cover with plastic wrap, and refrigerate until ready to serve.
- Let the dip sit out at room temperature for 15 to 20 minutes before serving. To serve, use a spoon to make a swirl through the center of the dip and drizzle olive oil into it. Serve with pita bread, pita chips, and/or crudités.

Om Ali is an Egyptian version of bread pudding. Basically it is the same idea, soaking some type of bread with dairy and sugar and baking it in the oven. Om Ali skips the eggs though, which makes this version lighter in texture, looser and milkier as opposed to custardy. Instead of bread, it is traditionally made with baked puff pastry, phyllo or roaa (Egyptian flat bread) combined with milk and nuts.

#### Om Ali

Servings: 6 people

Ingredients

1 package of frozen puff pastry sheets (2) thawed

\*\* 2/3 cup nuts/fruits (use any fruit/nut combination of your choice)

1 1/2 cup milk

1 tbsp. white sugar or to taste

1/2 tsp. vanilla extract

1 cup heavy cream

Powdered sugar- to taste

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 F
- Cut the puff sheet into squares and place in a baking sheet lined with parchment
- Poke holes in each square using a fork and bake for 15 minutes or until golden
- In an oven safe dish (2 quarts size); break the baked squares into chunks.
- Mix in nuts/fruits.
- Heat milk in the microwave for 1 minute. Dissolve sugar in warm milk and add vanilla extract.
- Pour milk over the puff pastry and let it soak in for 5-10 minutes.
- Whip heavy cream with powdered sugar to soft peaks.
- Spread the whipped cream over the top, and broil in the oven for 5-10 minutes until top is golden. Serve hot or at room temperature.
- \*\* Traditionally walnuts, hazelnuts, almonds, pistachios and raisins are used.



#### **CWL Dog Park Rules & Regulations**

- 1. Purpose: The Candlewick Lake Dog Park (the "Dog Park"), as identified by the Board, has been developed to give Members a place where the dogs of Residents can run free. For everyone's safety and enjoyment, you and your dog(s) are required to adhere to the following rules and regulations while visiting the Dog Park.
- 2. Rules and Regulations:
  - 2.1 Use of the Dog Park is prohibited unless the Resident using the Dog Park has purchased the required tag (the "Tag").
  - 2.2 To obtain a dog park tag, all dogs must have proof of a current up-to-date rabies tag. It is recommended that dogs be current on all their shots; especially kennel cough, distemper, paro virus and a yearly fecal exam.
  - 2.3 Residents will pay \$10/dog/year for a Tag. Fees are based on a fiscal year (May 1-April 30), and not when the Tag is purchased. There will be a \$5 replacement fee for lost tags.
  - 2.4 Residents purchasing tags must read the Dog Park Rules and Regulations (collectively the "Dog Park Rules") and agree in writing that they understand and assume all responsibility for the risk associated with using this facility.
  - 2.5 Tags may be revoked and/or fines charged for non-adherence to the Dog Park Rules, and/or if the Resident is not in good standing with the
  - 2.6 The Dog Park is divided into two areas: one area is for dogs weighing 25 lbs and under; and the other area is for all dogs.
  - 2.7 Dog park hours are from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. or dusk, whichever is later. Public Safety will lock and unlock the Dog Park daily. The Association reserves the right to change, at any time, the times and days the Dog Park is open.
- 3. Usage Rules:
- 3.1 Use of the Dog Park is restricted only to members and their dogs that have been issued proper, valid, and current Tags. Use of the Dog Park by those that do not have a current Tag is prohibited, although more than one person may be present for each dog.
- 3.2 Uses of the Dog Park for anything other than personal/residential use of the Dog Park with a dog with a valid Tag is prohibited, including but not limited to dog training classes, solicitation of dogs, and other similar uses.
- 3.3 Dogs must be under control and in the sight of the user at all times. The user shall be and remain responsible for the behavior of the user's dog(s).
- 3.4 If a user's dog is aggressive, the user must leash the dog. Said leash shall not exceed seven feet in length. The user agrees that the user will address any aggressive behavior before it escalates. If the dog is still aggressive after reasonable steps have been timely taken, the user agrees to remove the user's dog(s) promptly. If aggressive dog owner refuses to remove aggressive dog it is the right of other dog owners to call Public Safety. Public Safety will use their discretion to rectify the situation.
- 3.5 Candlewick Lake reserves the right, at any time, with or without written notice, to refuse to issue, and/or revoke the Tags of dogs displaying aggression or intimidating behavior towards other dogs or people. No refunds will be given for revoked Tags. Candlewick Lake **Rec Manager is** hereby empowered to make these decisions in their discretion.
- 3.6 Registration and rabies tags must be worn on all dog collars and visible at all times when using the Dog Park.
- In the event of a dog bite or other injury, each user who is involved, either on their own or through their dog(s), shall exchange Tag and other reasonably-required information such as a name, telephone number, and address.
- By their use of the Dog Park, users stipulate and agree that they know and understand that not all dogs like other dogs. Users agree to research methods to help understand dog behavior and socialization as needed. Users also acknowledge by their use of the Dog Park that some dogs

- growl when they play with other dogs, and thus just because one dog is growling does not mean that it is necessarily being aggressive.
- 3.9 Absolutely no food is allowed to be brought into the Dog Park, including but not limited to dog treats. All dogs have great sniffers and can become aggressive **even** when food is in a pocket.
- 3.10 The maximum number of dogs that any one user may bring to the Dog Park at the same time is four.
- 3.11 Users must carry a leash and a cleanup bag at all times when using the Dog Park. Users are required to immediately pick up after their dog(s). All dog waste must be disposed of properly in onsite refuse containers if available. If such containers are not onsite and able to be used, the user shall dispose of the waste in a proper manner offsite, for it shall not be an excuse that the Association containers are not onsite and able to be used. Users are encouraged to clean up the waste of others if they see one to help keep the area clean.
- 3.12 All objects used for dogs such as tennis balls, frisbees, and other dog toys must be removed when leaving the Dog Park. The Association reserves the right to discard any such objects left at the Dog Park.
- 3.13 Users must be 16 years of age or older. Users between the ages of 11 and 15 must be accompanied by an adult. Children age 10 and under are not allowed at the Dog Park. Users hereby acknowledge, by their use of the Dog Park, that the restriction of Children age 10 and under is for their own protection.
- 3.14 Male dogs must be neutered. Female dogs in heat are not allowed inside the Dog Park. No dogs under 6 months of age are allowed.
- 3.15 Smoking and/or consumption of alcohol beverages are both strictly prohibited.
- 3.16 Non-member dogs are not allowed in the Dog Park. Users allowing non-member dogs into the dog park may have their Tags revoked.
- 3.17 Users are discouraged from allowing their dogs from standing at or near the gate as people are trying to enter. Users agree to not enter if another dog is at the gate unattended.
- 4. Additional Provisions:
- 4.1 All users of the Dog Park, by virtue of their use thereof, acknowledge their notice that the Dog Park is not supervised, and that use is at the user's own risk. To the fullest extent allowed by law, users of the Dog Park, by virtue of their use thereof, stipulate and agree that Candlewick Lake Association is not responsible for injury or damage to any user, dog, animal, or other property, and waive any and all claims they may have against Candlewick Lake Association (including employees, officers, directors, and agents thereof) related to the use of the Dog Park.
- 4.2 Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit, alter, or otherwise restrict the applicability of other rules, regulations, and restrictions on pets in Candlewick Lake.
- 4.3 The Association reserves the right to, at any time, amend these Rules and Regulations, close (temporarily and/or permanently) the Dog Park, and impose additional rules and regulations. In such event or events, there shall be no redress or compensation to anyone as a result of such event or events, including but not limited to those persons that have purchased tags.
- 4.4 In the event one or more provisions contained herein is now or in the future violates any applicable rule, regulation, statute, law, or other applicable provision of the law, said provision(s) shall be automatically amended to the least extent possible to bring said provision(s) into compliance with the law. In the event a person that has been issued a Tag is aware (or believes) that of a provision contained herein violates the law, it is the responsibility of said person to timely notify the Association of such knowledge or belief as a pre-condition to any request for redress due to such actual or alleged violation.


