There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2023 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.

Clubhouse & Course Manager at Savannah Oaks

You may notice a different look and feel at the Savannah Oaks clubhouse in 2025. We are fortunate to have Ben Wilken, who has taken over the reins as manager. Ben

brings top qualifications and professionalism to the job and hopes to develop the full potential of both our golf course and clubhouse.

So, who is Ben? Ben is a Candlewick Lake resident who has lived in our community for 3 1/2 years with his beloved dog, Holly. Ben served 5 1/2 years in the Navy – thank you for your service!! After that, he built a 20-year civilian career working in retail, sales development, and marketing. His most recent experience was six years as the Business Development Manager at Royal Pub & Grill in Freeport, a 6,000 square-foot



facility that includes a liquor store, bar, and full kitchen. And to top it off, Ben is an entrepreneur. He previously owned a frozen yogurt store in Bolingbrook and currently owns a marketing company. Ben's dedication to hard work and finding solutions is evident to his customers and staff.

When not working on ways to improve the customer experience at Savannah Oaks (which doesn't leave much free time), Ben enjoys photography and playing pickleball. I asked Ben why he decided to take this position of manager at Savannah Oaks. He explained that being retired military he does receive financial benefits. However, he wanted to get more involved in the community, as well earn some additional income. Initially, he thought it might be fun to work part time as a bartender. Then, the manager position opened up and, given the perfect fit, "the rest is history."

What do you like most about your job?

Ben replied, "the clientele – they are truly nice people. I like that there is accountabil-

ity to the community because everyone knows each other. And just as important, is my staff. We have a great group of people working now who are focused on providing the best possible service. None of what I hope to accomplish is possible without my staff. They deserve a lot of the credit. I am the idea guy, but the staff is responsible for the execution."

We then discussed the challenges and goals for his transi-

His first priority was improving the visual appeal of the clubhouse. He said "presentation" is key to a welcoming environment. Ben and his staff rearranged the seating to provide more space in the dining room. They have added new and more modern décor. Cleanliness is an area of focus throughout the clubhouse and kitchen.

Cost control.

Ben is convinced that they can provide a high quality of food and service, but still control expenses responsibly. He believes that he, and all in management at CWL, should be aware that the decisions they make and expenses involved do affect the fees paid by the residents.

"Better experience for the customers is essential for success." Ben has worked, and will continue to work, with the board to expand the food choices. One of the first things he did was to create menus for the tables and standardize pricing to be more family friendly. You will notice that the servers now come to your table to take your order and are trained to be pro-active to make sure customers are aware of new items available and upcoming events.

Also, Ben is encouraging food take-out. There are now takeout menus that people can bring home. He said, "I wanted to reach out to those in the community that may not want to be in the bar atmosphere, but still can have access to the convenience of food pick-up so close to their homes." The take-out menus will also be at the Rec Center and Administrative Office. I asked Ben to discuss his vision for the future, and possible changes he'd like to make to both the golf course and clubhouse experience. Some of his ideas include:

- Open course and clubhouse at 7:00 am during golf season.
- Add breakfast food items such as egg sandwiches and breakfast pizzas
- Keep expanding food menu such as adding french fries or tater tot sides and salads

- More inclusive events that appeal not only to golfers but the entire community. Specifically, he wants to start soon a Networking Evening in which the residents of CWL can connect. This will be a weekday evening at which people can gather at the clubhouse to meet fellow local businesses and service providers such as painters, landscapers, hair salons, pet care, cleaning services, etc. This will be a great way to help meet the needs of people in the community, while supporting your neighbors. He sees this as possibly a monthly event.

- Individual Golf Contest Days such as Longest Drive and Putting contests

What are Ben's thoughts on the golf course?

He first mentioned he works closely with Shawn Chisamore, who is our course Greenskeeper and Department Head of Course Maintenance. I think most golfers will agree that the course is in great condition Shawn continues to make improvements. His most recent change is on Hole #7 cutting back the trees and bushes on the right side of the fairway. Also, he hopes to have the new putting and chipping practice green that is near the first tee, open in May 2025.

Ben wanted to emphasize that he and Shawn have a common goal of ensuring "Respect and Proper Etiquette on the Golf Course."

What this means is that course rules will be posted and enforced and irresponsible behavior or damage to the course will not be tolerated. Ben hopes to have a Ranger on the course at peak times to ensure an enjoyable golf experience.

In closing, Ben made it clear that "people having fun is most important, even over profits because that is what will draw more residents to utilize our facilities". Ben is well aware of the great potential for growth. He explained, "I especially enjoy the challenge of the dynamic atmosphere at Savannah Oaks. Every day is different." Ben is serious, diligent and focused on getting things done. However, now and then after a successful event, or a proud moment witnessing the good service of his staff, or watching his patrons clearly enjoying themselves, you may see a small, but very sweet smile, emerge on our new leader's face.

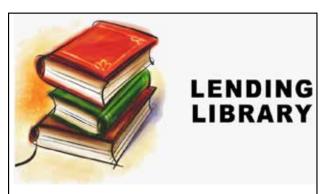

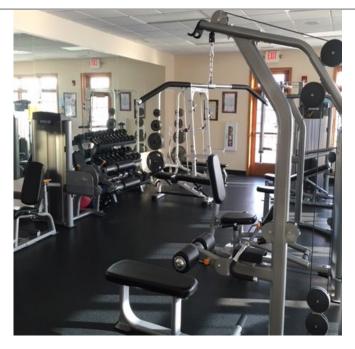

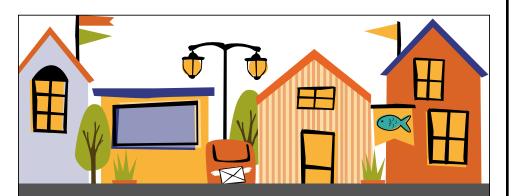

From the Table - Just a Bite

The Magic of Mushrooms

Did you know there are more than 10,000 varieties of mushrooms? The most common varieties found in US grocery stores are (white) Button, Portabella and Baby Bella (Cremini), but in the last few years many other varieties have found their way into grocery stores and Farmer's Markets, such as: Shitake, Lions Mane, Morel, and Black Trumpet/Horn of Plenty, Chanterelles, Maitake/Hen in the Woods, King Trumpet and more.

In 2024, mushroom sales increased by 20% as they became showcased in restaurant dishes, drinks and snacks across the nation.

Mushrooms are hearty, full of nutrients, easy to cook and have a savory flavor and texture similar to meat, so they provide the same, what chefs call "mouth feel" as meat, and therefore they are a common substitute for meat in vegetarian friendly dishes.

Mushrooms can be used in an unlimited variety of ways: soups, sauces, roasted, grilled and baked. I personally think that mushrooms are often given a bad rap by consumers who have only experienced eating canned mushrooms. I'm not saying they are bad. I grew up eating canned mushrooms in homemade chop suey and on pizza, because fresh mushrooms were not widely available where we lived. But there is a world of difference between the flavor and texture of canned mushrooms and fresh.

However, it is important to know what to look for when purchasing fresh mushrooms, how to store them and how to prepare them for best results.

Button, Portabella and Baby Bella (Crimini) varieties.

Buying: Look for mushrooms that look smooth, fresh and dry. Avoid mushrooms that have dark spots or appear wet or slimy.

Storing: They can be stored in their original packaging and refrigerated for 5 days. It has been suggested that any unused mushrooms can be placed in a paper bag and returned to the refrigerator for later use.

Preparation: Mushrooms can be wiped clean with a damp paper towel or rinsed under running water and then **dried immediately** with paper towels. **DO NOT let mushrooms sit/soak in water!**

Portabella - Caps range in size from 4"-6". They have a dense flesh and a steak like texture. These are great for grilled mushroom burgers and also good sautéed or in baked dishes. Note: Portabella have black gills in the cap. To avoid muddy looking sauces, gently scrape out the gills with a spoon, before cooking.

White Button - Have a mild flavor that becomes meaty when cooked. These are also good grilled, sautéed and baked.

Baby Bella (Cremini) – These are basically baby Portabellas that have been harvested before maturity and are generally the same size as white button mushrooms but browner and firmer and with a more intense flavor than white button. They are also great for grilling, sautéing and baking.

Cooking mushrooms in general: mushrooms have very high moisture content so when cooking mushrooms, high heat is often important to remove excess liquid quickly so, they can brown and enhance their flavors.

***There are exceptions to this guideline, as in the recipe I'm sharing with you today.

Years ago one of my favorite restaurants called The Village Squire served a dish made with onions, mushrooms, Swiss cheese and sautéed with what I thought was some kind of wine and served in a pita. Although the restaurant still exists, it stopped serving this version of the dish long ago.

Over the years, I played around with the ingredients and proportions and came up with what I think closely tastes like their dish. I have no recollection what The Village Squire called their dish back then, but when my family wants to have it, they say... Make that dish, you know, the one with the mushroom, onion and Swiss cheese stuff that that restaurant in Dundee made, you know, the one where they had all the peanut shells all over the floor... so here it is.

You Know-That Mushroom, Onion, Swiss Cheese Thing







Ingredients:

16 oz. sliced mushrooms, your choice- cremini, white button or both

1 to 1 1/2 cups sliced onions

1/2 cup dry sherry or more to taste

8 oz. or more shredded Swiss cheese

Butter- 3-4 tbsp or more- varies 1 tsp. Canola oil

Naan bread (I use the smaller size but you can use the larger size for a really big "sandwich" or cut it in half for 2 servings)

Directions:

- 1. On low heat, slowly melt 3 tbsp butter and the canola oil in a very large frying pan.
- 2. Add the onions to the pan. Stir to coat all the onions with the melted butter/oil. Cover the pan and continue cooking onions on low heat until onions are translucent and tender.
- 3. Add another tablespoon of butter to the pan (or more if needed) allow to melt and then stir in the sliced mushrooms, coating the mushrooms with the melted butter. Cover the pan and continue cooking the mushrooms on low heat until tender, stirring occasionally.
- 4. Slowly pour in the sherry. (You are cooking on a low flame/heat, so adding the sherry should not flare up but be cautious and have the pot lid ready to cover the flames if needed)
- 5. Stir to blend the sherry with the other ingredients.
- 6. Uncover the pan and continue cooking at low heat until most of the liquid evaporates.
- Add shredded cheese, mix together, and allow cheese to melt. Turn off the heat and cover pan until ready to serve.
- 8. Warm naan bread. Spoon mixture down the center of the bread. And eat like a taco.

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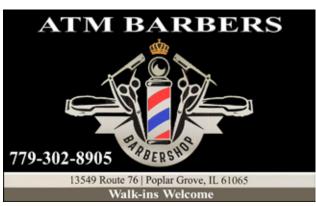
