Most of the children were delighted with the Easter Bunny, while a few younger ones were terrified at the sight of such a large rabbit.. Gotta give 'em a little time I guess..

There were three craft tables where kids could make a choice of what they would like to make. Among the choices were a table where they could make hatching Easter eggs from construction paper and a clothes pin, or perhaps a bunny hand puppet with cotton balls, or they might choose to make an Easter basket from a paper plate and pipe cleaners. Watercraft Registration & Renewals Email documents to cwl@candlewicklake.org
Boats & Personal Watercraft (Jet-skis/Waverunners)

Mail, email, or drop off your current registration, proof of \$100,000.00 liability insurance, and the completed watercraft registration form and a new decal will be issued. Maximum boat length is 20' and there is a 90 HP limit on all motors operating on the lake.

There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2023 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.

Anyone age 16 and over is required to always have an Illinois Fishing License and a Candlewick Guest Fishing Permit in their immediate possession while fishing at Candlewick Lake. Active-duty military personnel and disabled veterans need to present a Military ID in lieu of an Illinois Fishing License and Candlewick Guest Fishing Pass.

Information

It is not necessary to renew your Member ID card if your Member ID card has your bar code printed on it. The following amenities will be included with your dues and will require a Member ID card. Your Member ID card must be presented at the time of service.

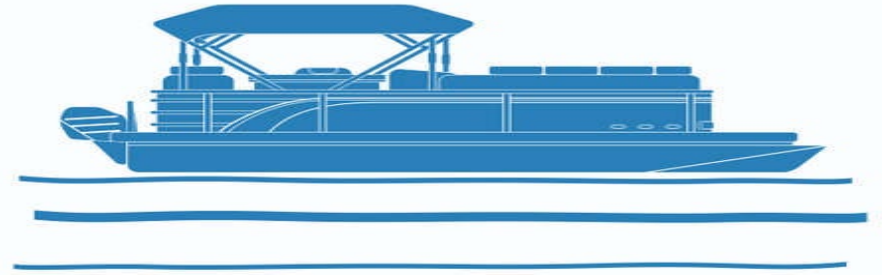

Waiver Forms

A waiver form must be on file if you, your children, or your guests wish to use the pool, fitness center, gym, or participate in any classes or camps. All guests under the age of 18 must have the waiver form signed by their parent or legal guardian. Waiver forms that are already on file are still valid. Contact the Recreation Center for more information. Blank waiver forms are available online, at the Recreation Center, and at the Administration Office.



Please remember to update your boat sticker for the new boating season.

Stickers expire at the end of April 2024. If you had your boat registered for the 2023 season, here is what you need to do to get your new sticker:

Make sure we have a current copy of your state registration, and a current copy of your Marine Public Liability and property damage insurance (\$100,000 minimum) If the watercraft is equipped with a motor exceeding ten (10) horsepower.

If your boat was not registered last season you will need to bring in a current copy of your state registration, and a current copy of your Marine Public Liability and property damage insurance (\$100,000 minimum) If the watercraft is equipped with a motor exceeding ten (10) horsepower.

Your boat will have to be reinspected by Public Safety before the sticker is issued.

If you are registering a new boat or a new to you boat that may have been on Candlewick Lake previously you will need to bring in a current copy of your state registration, and a current copy of your Marine Public Liability and property damage insurance (\$100,000 minimum) If the watercraft is equipped with a motor exceeding ten (10) horsepower.

Your boat will then need to be inspected by Public Safety before the sticker will be issued.

If you have a vessel that does not have a motor an inspection will not be required. Your unit/lot number is required on both sides of the vessel.

Boats may not exceed 20 feet in length (inches will be excluded in length). A maximum horsepower of 90 hp is allowed to travel at wake speed. Any motor over 90hp will require a special use permit and is allowed at no-wake speed – idle speed only.

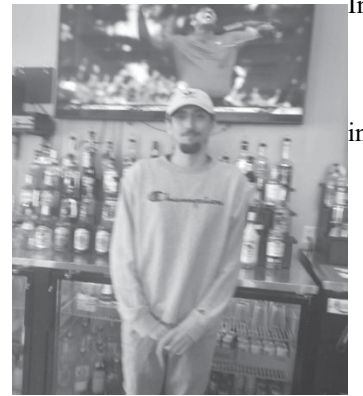

From the Table - Just a Bite

It's May and you know what that means... **MOTHER'S DAY!**

Did you know more phone calls are made on Mother's Day than any other day of the year?

Do you ever wonder how it all began? NO! I don't mean the birds and the bees part! Let's get past that to the crux of the story,

Celebrations of mothers and motherhood go back to the ancient Greek and Roman festivals honoring the mother Goddesses Rhea & Cybele. Early Christians celebrated Mothering Sunday, which referred to honoring the Mother Church; but over time became more secular. It became a time when children honored their mothers by giving them flowers and small gifts as tokens of appreciation.

The origins of Mother's Day in the U S is attributed to three women, Ann Reeves Jarvis, Julia Ward Howe and *Anna Jarvis and dates back to pre Civil War days. In the mid 1800s, Ann Reeves Jarvis organized "Mother's Day Work Clubs" which helped to promote healthier conditions for raising children. During the Civil War, she organized "Women's Brigades," encouraging women to help without regard to which side their men had chosen in the war.

Enter Julia Ward Howe. During the Civil War, she worked with the US Sanitary Commission to provide sanitary conditions during the care of the sick and wounded soldiers.

In 1868, Jarvis organized "Mother's Friendship Day" in which mothers gathered with soldiers from both sides of the conflict to promote reconciliation.

In 1870, Howe called for a "Mother's Day For Peace," dedicated to the eradication of war in her "Mother's Day Proclamation."

The official Mother's Day holiday arose from the efforts of Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann Reeves Jarvis following her mother's death in 1905. She envisioned Mother's Day as a way of honoring the sacrifices mothers made for their children; perhaps by giving each mother a white carnation to be worn in church to honor them as mothers.

The first official Mother's Day celebration was held in a church in Grafton, West Virginia, and also in a store in Philadelphia in 1908. Following the success of this first celebration, Jarvis was determined to make it a national holiday. She started a massive letter writing campaign, and by 1912, many states, towns and churches celebrated Mother's Day as an annual event. Then in 1914, President Woodrow Wilson officially established the second Sunday in May as the official National Mother's Day.

Mother's Day serves to honor the way mothers have raised and nurtured their children with love and courage. And the way we honor them has come full circle; giving flowers and small tokens of appreciation and... sometimes serving her breakfast in bed, which brings us to this month's recipes... Just a little something to sweeten her day.



Apricot Scones, Devonshire Cream and Fresh Strawberries.

Ingredients:

Devonshire Cream:

3 ounces cream cheese, softened 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 tablespoon confectioners sugar 1/4 to 1/3 cup heavy whipping cream

Scones:

2 cups all purpose flour 1/2 cup chopped dried apricots
1/4 cup sugar 1/2 cup chopped pecans
1 tablespoon baking powder 1 teaspoon grated orange peel
1/4 teaspoon salt 1 cup plus 2 tbsp. heavy whipping cream, divided
1/3 cup cold butter

Jam of your choice and or fresh strawberries (optional)

Directions for Devonshire Cream:

1. Beat cream cheese, confectioners' sugar and vanilla until fluffy.
2. Gradually beat in enough cream to achieve spreading consistency.
3. Cover and chill at least 2 hours.

Directions for Scones:

1. Combine the dry ingredients together in a bowl.
2. Cut in butter until mixture resembles fine crumbs.
3. Add apricots, pecans and orange peel, mix.
4. Rapidly stir in 1 cup whipping cream just until moistened.
5. Turn onto floured surface; knead 5-6 times.
6. Divide dough in half and shape each into a ball.
7. Flatten each ball into a 6 inch circle and cut each circle into eight wedges.
8. Place wedges 1 inch apart on ungreased baking sheet and brush each wedge with the remaining whipped cream.
9. Bake at 375 degrees f. for 13-15 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.
10. Remove from pan to a wire rack.

Serve warm with Devonshire cream, jam and fresh strawberries if desired

Yield: 16 scones and 1 cup cream.



Note: If you serve with fresh strawberries you may want a double recipe of the Devonshire Cream. Fresh strawberries dipped in Devonshire Cream are heavenly!

*An interesting twist to the Ann Jarvis story is how after years of trying and succeeding to establish

Mothers' Day as a National Holiday. She spent decades and all her money actively lobbying the government to remove it from the American calendar. She had become disgusted with how the holiday had become so commercialized. By the time of her death in 1948 Jarvis had disavowed the holiday altogether. She died penniless in a sanitarium.

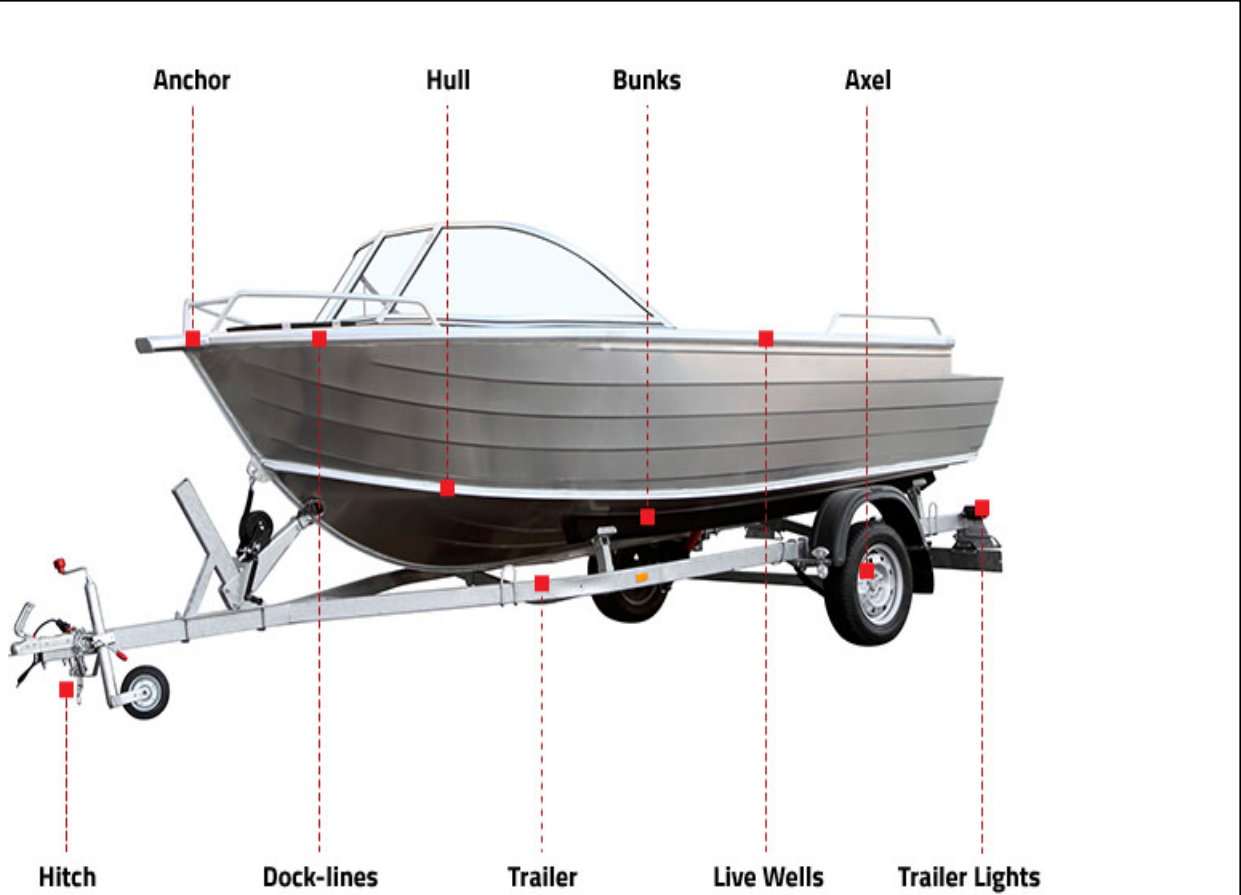
