Watercraft Registration & Renewals Email documents to cwl@candlewicklake.org
Boats & Personal Watercraft (Jet-skis/Waverunners)

Mail, email, or drop off your current registration, proof of \$100,000.00 liability insurance,

and the completed watercraft registration form and a new decal will be issued.

Maximum boat length is 20' and there is a 90 HP limit on all motors operating on the lake.

There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2022 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.

Anyone age 16 and over is required to always have an Illinois Fishing License and a Candlewick Guest Fishing Permit in their immediate possession while fishing at Candlewick Lake. Active-duty military personnel and disabled veterans need to present a Military ID in lieu of an Illinois Fishing License and Candlewick Guest Fishing Pass.

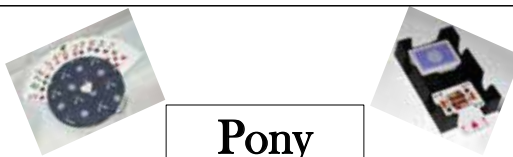

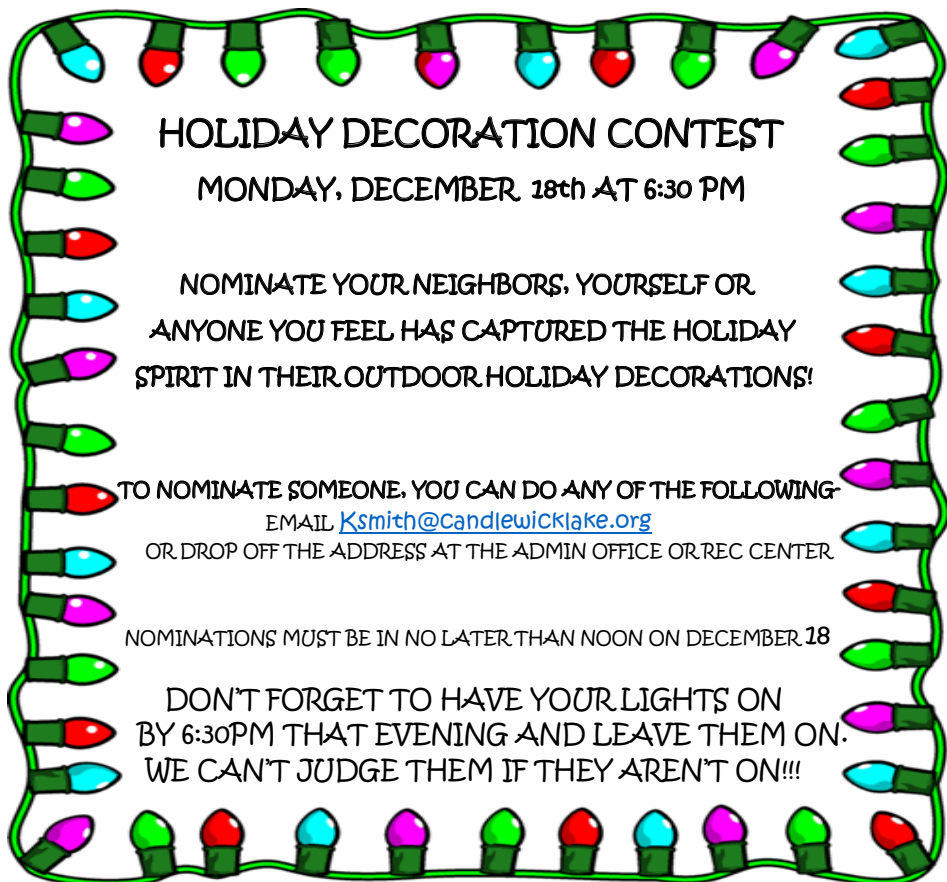

Trip of a Lifetime

If you are looking for a phenomenal adventure for yourself, you and your significant other or your family, a MUST DO is South Africa and Victoria Falls.

My husband and I recently returned from our trip. When trying to convey the stupendous adventures we had to our family and friends, we were at a loss for words at times.

The adventure began in Capetown, the oldest city in South Africa, where we toured with our guide around the city, went up to Table Top Mountain via a cable gondola to around 3,000 feet and visited the oldest residential neighborhood, Bo-Kaap. While in Bo-Kaap, we were met by the oldest family that lives there and were treated in their home with traditional snacks. Lastly, we went to Cape of Good Hope, the southern most tip of Africa where we mingled with the African penguins.

Now it's off to safaris at Sabi Sands private game reserve. We went on five safaris over the three days we were there. The safaris were stupendous!!! We saw elephants (my favorite), rhinos, hippos, lions, leopards, hyenas, giraffes, zebras, many varieties of antelope, cape buffalo, baboons, ostrich (which are rare), wildebeest, wild cat (super rare), crocodile, cheetah, warthog, and impala - all while driving thru the bush and dry riverbeds in a wide-open jeep. We got as close as 20 feet to the animals.

Our last stop was Victoria Falls. BREATHTAKING is all I can say. We walked at least a mile and did not come to the end of the falls. A breakfast cruise on the Zambezi River was filled with hippos. WOW!!! We visited a subsistence living village and met and talked with them which was quite eye opening, and later shopped at a market where we think we probably



paid too much for some items. I LOVE ELEPHANTS! We went to an elephant encounter where we got to pet and feed the elephants. There was one handful of feed left and I took it. Then the

elephant spewed the food all over me.

We are planning to go back and visit Kenya, Tanzania, and the Serengeti. We have traveled quite a bit, and South Africa by far is our favorite. MUST GO!!!

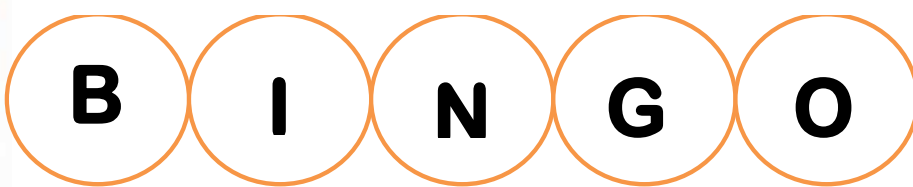

From the Table - Just a Bite

How the Potato Changed the World

A bold statement I know, but hear me out. I know that turkey usually takes center stage at Thanksgiving. All the oohs and ahs as the golden crusted bird is lifted from the oven, but let us not short shrift the other supporting components of the meal.

I decided for this month's article rather than talk turkey (so to speak), I'd talk potato. It is one of the "traditional" foods at Thanksgiving, and it has its own amazing story, and it truly has changed the world!

Christopher Columbus is celebrated for finding America, but he is also responsible for returning to Europe laden with Native American food crops, previously unknown to the world. Columbus arrived in Europe with potatoes around 1570.

Adoption of the potato was slow, but once farmers adapted the potato to European climates, it spread throughout Europe. The Spanish were the first to feed their armies and to help prevent scurvy with this tuber. Next came Britain in 1585, Belgium and Germany in 1587, Austria in 1588, Ireland in 1589, and France in 1600. By the 20th century, potatoes became accepted around the world. It had also become an essential crop worldwide.

Potatoes are the third most important food crop in the world after rice and wheat. Potatoes can be grown in a wide range of climates and in many different types of soil. They are grown on every continent except Antarctica and the Arctic Circle.

Countries, including Africa have used potatoes to help combat famine.

In 1995, the astronauts in the Microgravity Astroculture Laboratory on the Space Shuttle Columbia grew five small potatoes while in orbit!; which proved they could be a food source on longer space voyages.

Over 1 billion people eat at least one potato each day. Its high caloric value and wide variety of types enable it to appear in every cuisine in the world. There are over 5,000 varieties and hundreds of ways to prepare them: curries, dips, dumplings, soups, salads, and pancakes, as a thickener in sauces and stews and as a binding agent in cake mixes, doughs, and ice creams.

And while the common perception is that potatoes are fattening, potatoes actually contain 0 grams of fat! They do contain carbohydrate, but there are also healthy nutrients that are important for our bodies. A medium-sized potato contains 620 milligrams of potassium, which is more than a banana! Potatoes are also packed with antioxidants and Vitamins B6 and C.

You will find potatoes have been immortalized in art and literature by Shakespeare, Van Gogh, and James Joyce. Potatoes were traded for gold during the Klondike Gold Rush. These sprouts have risen to the point where they are celebrated on National Potato Days (August 19 and October 27). Even the United Nations declared 2008 as the Year of the Potato!

Personally, give me a baked potato covered with chili or salsa or broccoli and cheese, and I am a happy camper. Potato pancakes with applesauce - yum! I don't need a special day to honor them! But here is a different type of recipe I hope you will enjoy!

Moroccan Sweet Potato Stew with Raisins

Serves 6

Ingredients:

- | | |

| 1 ½ cups onions, chopped | 3 medium sweet potatoes peeled and cut into 2 inch pieces |
| 2 cloves garlic, minced | 1 medium red bell pepper, seeded and coarsely chopped |
| 1 teaspoon ground turmeric | 1 small eggplant, peeled and cubed |
| ¾ teaspoon ground cinnamon | ½ cup vegetable broth |
| ½ teaspoon curry powder | 1-15 oz. can garbanzo beans |
| ½ teaspoon ground cumin | 1-16 oz. can chopped tomatoes |
| ½ teaspoon salt | 1 cup raisins or to taste |
| ½ teaspoon ground black pepper | fresh cilantro for garnish |
| ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg | |
| ¼ teaspoon red pepper flakes | |

Instructions:

- Combine onions and garlic in a large saucepan and cook covered over low heat until onion is soft and translucent- about 10 minutes. Add a little water if necessary.
- Stir in spices (turmeric, cinnamon, curry, cumin, salt, pepper, nutmeg and red pepper flakes). Cook 3-5 minutes.
- Stir in sweet potatoes, red pepper, eggplant and broth.
- Heat to boil.
- Reduce heat to low and simmer, covered for 5 minutes.
- Add garbanzo beans, tomatoes and raisins.
- Simmer, covered, until sweet potatoes are tender, about 35 minutes.
- Serve and garnish with cilantro if desired.

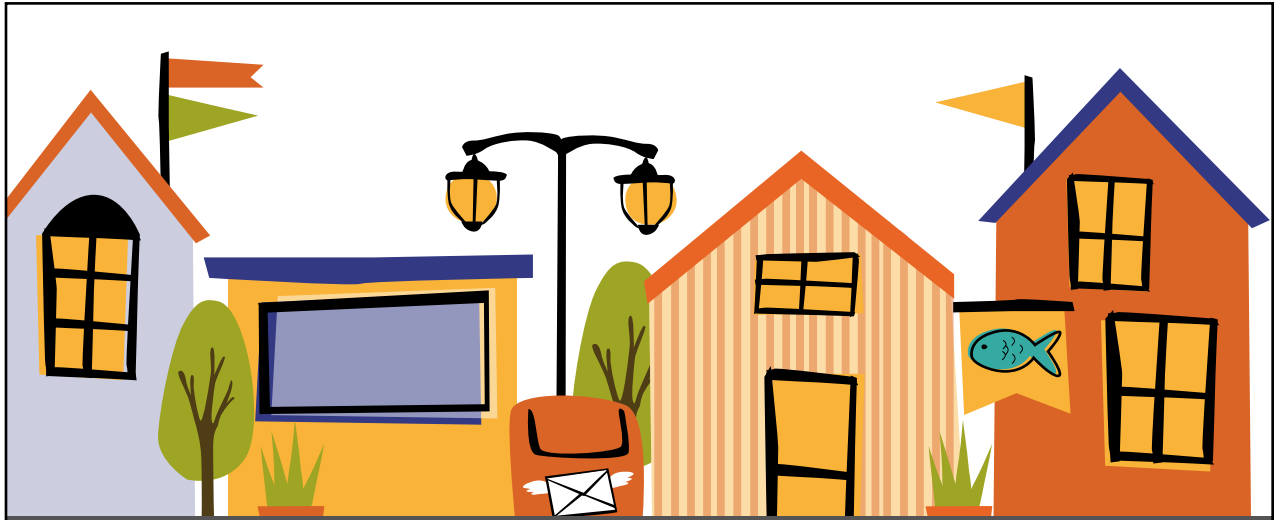

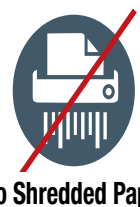

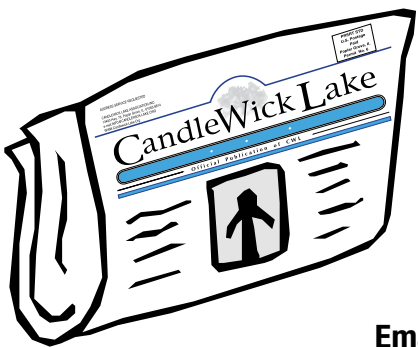
