# None of Your Beeswax!

Our Candlewick Garden Club had an interesting speaker this past October 12. Candlewick resident and local bee keeper, Mike Hruby, spoke about all the interesting facts concerning the world of bees. I was surprised to learn that bees are technically part of the termite family, but since there are over 20,000 species of bees, it must be a very distant part of the family.

Mike went on to describe all the jobs various bees assume in the colony, with the three main players being the queen, the worker bees, and finally the drone. The queen's main duty is to lay eggs, while her comfort and food needs are handled by the worker bees, while the drone's main duty is to protect the hive, and if he's lucky, to mate with the queens of many different hives. Since the drones are the only bees that are male and capable of mating, the downside for them is that after mating, they die

The bee has an amazing optical capability, being able to see colors that are invisible to humans. They can see a spectrum of color ranging from infrared up to and including ultraviolet. They use this capability to be able to navigate an area up to five miles around the colony searching for pollen from flowers and plants that invite the bee with different colors, and return to the colony by memory.

Although the main product of bees is honey, Mike went on to explain that at this time of year, the beekeeper has to be careful not to harvest too much honey, which the colony will use to survive the winter. The structure of the enclosure which houses the bees has the honey storage above the area where the bees will cluster in the winter. As they cluster together, the bees will "vibrate" their wings to produce enough body heat to shelter the colony, and the body heat will rise to keep the honey pliable enough for the colony's food needs over the winter. Mike passed around some of the creations that bees store honey in for all to inspect.

Mike brought some supplies where the ladies of the club could make their own beehive enclosures from old paper towel tubes and such, but from what I could tell, I think most of the ladies figured they'd leave the beekeeping to the pros. Mike was a wealth of information about bees, having done it over 20 years, so I'd say he is one of the pros!

# Farm Stroll 2024 at Alpaca Pines

Say CHEESE...

We couldn't have asked for a better day for the 2024 Farm Stroll. There were no shortages of farms to visit with at least 10 to choose from, with farming specialties from honey to milk to how most of our food is grown. Farming is a great way of life, but there sure is a lot of work involved from making sure cows are milked on time along with an amazing list of chores to be tended to.

I ended up at Alpaca Pines, which is owned and operated by Candlewick residents Bob and Vicki Donley. They have had the farm for many years and have quite an assortment of animals on the farm including geese,

chickens, and ducks, but the main animal is alpacas, although I saw a llama or two. The main product from the animals is their fiber, which is much sought after for high end sweaters and other quality wear.

I never knew much about these animals, but there was abundant information about their history available. The Donley family currently has 35 Alpacas on their farm. They are part of the camel family which has its roots in the high countries of Peru, Bolivia, and Chile. Their fiber is hypoallergenic and contains no lanolin, which causes itching in other fibers such as wool. Since they are only

shorn once a year around Mother's day, it's a short "harvest season," if you can call it that. The gestation time for these animals is 11.5 months, and they generally live around 17-19 years. The farm also has a spinning mill on site to offer the finished product.

The animals appeared to be quite calm, although I'm told that they "spit" at one another when they become annoyed. They also said that they rarely spit at humans, but when I took a picture of one guy who I had been petting, he sure appeared to be thinkin' bout it!! Lotsa Fun!!

Do you remember the movie "Mommie Dearest", in which Faye Dunaway portrays actress Joan Crawford? There is a scene in which, looking into the closet, a totally out of control Joan is yelling at her young daughter, "NO MORE WIRE HANGERS!"

Well, over the years I have amassed quite a collection of cookbooks; so many so that my sister refers to them as "wire hangers"- with the suggestion that I may want

to thin out my collection...just a bit.



Periodically, I have taken her suggestion to purge some of my cookbook library and steeled my resolve to avoid buying more "wire hangers" by limiting my search in bookstores to any genre EXCEPT cookbooks- murder mysteries, biographies, romance, history, anything...

You'd be amazed how many non-cookbooks include recipes. So, in the words of Michael Corleone (Godfather III) "Just when I thought I was out, they pull me back in."

The culprit? The book, The Sweet Potato Queen's Book of Love, (A fallen Southern Belle's look at Love, Life, Men, Marriage and Being Prepared by Jill Conner Browne.

In this book (one of several she has written), she offers up her funny, irreverent perspective along with several interesting sounding recipes written in her own unique style. This month, I share two of these from the chapter titled, "What to Eat When Tragedy Strikes..."

In her view, "Sometimes a life event is just too catastrophic for quick effortless remedies. You need something like..."

#### Armadillo Dip

"You brown about a pound or so of ground chuck. Pour off the grease; this is purely for the consistency of the dip, and in no way should be construed as a fat saving measure. Dump in a bunch of taco seasoning, hot picante sauce and hot Cheese Whiz. It's like a fancy Rotel- tomato- cheese dip- a staple at all Southern gatherings only hotter and more fattening.



Armadillo Dip is great on Fritos and Tostitos as long as they aren't the baked kind, which we're against."

Coming up next, a recipe under the heading "Funeral Food- The Brighter Side of Death,"-

"This is truly one of Nature's perfect foods; not just combining as it does sweet and salty, which would be enough of an accomplishment right there, but also having cheese in it... This is a very special dish! #### Miss Leslie's Pineapple Casserole


"You want to drain a 20 ounce can of pineapple (In its own juice.) chunks or tidbits. Save 3 tablespoons of the juice, and mix it with ½ cup of sugar and 3 tablespoons of flour. Stir that mixture in with the pineapple and 1 cup of sharp grated cheese. (I've never tried making it with fat free cheese and consider it blasphemous, but have used some reduced fat cheese when it was all I had, and it came out okay.) Dump all that into a greased casserole. Melt a stick of butter and stir into ½ cup of Ritz cracker crumbs; put that on top of the pineapple mixture. Bake it at 350 degrees for 20-30 minutes and prepare to be comforted."



Truth be told, I have not yet made this Casserole, but it's on my list to try along with several others in this book- like: Fat Mama's Knock You Naked Margaritas, Oh God Chocolate Caramel Pie, Come Back Sauce, Mimi's Butterfinger Cookies and more. However, I have tried her recipe called Chocolate Stuff and all I have to say about that is mmmmm!!!
