Fun with the Garden Club

All the work stations were set up and ready to go.

Leave it to the ladies of the Candlewick Garden Club to keep finding fun and educational things for the group to do. Club leaders Paula Kurpeski, Natalie Bader, and Kathy Batzkall arranged for an off-site monthly meeting that included a workshop where members could build a concrete leaf casting. The larger casting was fashioned with an elephant ear leaf, leaving the imprint of the leaf pressed into the finished design. The group also made a much smaller concrete casting, with the impression of a hosta leaf. This could be used in many areas around the home, such as a soap dish, spoon rest, and so on.

The workshop was held at Landscape Connection garden center on the south side of Rockford. I arrived a bit early and spoke to owner and instructor Michelle. I was kinda surprised the workshop would be held on a beautiful patio outdoors. Michelle joked that between mixing concrete and forming sand, things could become a bit messy, and being outdoors would make the cleanup much easier with a hose.

Each station had a small mound of sand, a small bucket with the proper amount of concrete added, an elephant ear leaf, a small hosta leaf, and a large spoon for the mixing.

Lots of busy hands!

Michelle explained to the group to form the sand into the profile they wanted the dish to be - flat, or more like a bowl. Michelle kept a close eye on the mixing, as adding too much water would make the concrete soupy and unmanageable. I saw many masterpieces being formed, while others not so much. After all 14 participants were finished, the leaf castings were to remain at the garden center for drying, to be picked up the following week for acrylic painting. As the class was dismissed, I heard a few folks saying they would like to use the leftover concrete to make snowballs! They're a rowdy bunch, don't ya know?

You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.





- 9. Entries are due by October 15.



Information

From the Table - Just a Bite

Last month's article about chickens reminded me of a story told by Alton Brown when I was lucky enough to see him in person at the Coronado Theatre in Rockford about a decade ago. Although he has been a host to a number of food shows, this was more than

just a food show. It had music - he sang, he rapped, he danced. He recounted food stories, sometimes hilarious and sometimes touching, surrounding events on Iron Man Chef and some family stories as well.

Alton began the show explaining that when he first started out, he realized that being in the public eye can change a person and they can lose their way. So he decided to write down in notebooks all the TRUTHS he knew about food and cooking. He filled notebooks, but over the years, with age and experience, he found himself eliminating and amending his truths until one day, he had only a handful of truths which he shared with the audience



First and foremost is that chickens DON'T have fingers! They don't. It's that simple. Regardless of what is listed on every child's menu in every restaurant and fast food emporium... Chickens do NOT have fingers. He shared this truth with his daughter early on. He taught his daughter right from wrong about food so she would know the truth.

When she turned 10, she was going to have a sleepover birthday party, and she came to her dad and asked him if he would cook for her party. He was touched and delighted. "What shall I make for you?" he asked. "Your favorite pork dish or maybe pizza?" "No," she said. "Chicken Fingers."

Oh my gosh! He was aghast! He wondered...had some sinister fellow tempted her on a street corner or one of her friends at school started her downward spiral? What to do??? Then, he thought, he would set the record straight and send the truth to all children in a ripple effect, starting with his daughter's sleepover.

He devised a plan. First, he went to an Asian grocery and got about 20 pounds of chicken feet. (He had worked in an Asian restaurant and knew how to prepare them.) He left the claws on. They are actually good as toothpicks if some meat becomes lodged in your teeth... Anyway, first you steam them and then you fry them. He had the perfect large platter for 20 pounds but he knew presentation is everything, and he wanted a cloche for the top. "You know the French," he said "They can't just say lid. It must be cloche." So, he went out to his garage and there was a Weber grill. He got some gold paint and some glitter (he figured little girls like glittery sparkly things). When he finished, he had his cloche.

The day arrived. The sleep over was in full swing, and it was time for food. Alton brought in the platter with the golden glittering cloche. All the girls looked on with great hungry anticipation...all except his daughter who stood there with her arms crossed and a look on her face showing she knew something was up. He lifted the cloche, and there were squeals, screams and a lot of running except for the daughter who said ... "I'll get you old man."

He knew his plan had worked. All he had to do was wait for the ripple effect. What he hadn't planned on were the calls the next day from all the mothers who pretty much said the same thing. "What were you thinking serving chicken feet, yada, yada, yada." He let them speak their piece and responded, "And how many food shows do you host?" before hanging up on them.

Oh, and his daughter's revenge...some time later he awoke one morning and tucked his feet into his slippers only to find a scorpion. It was dead and he never got stung, but he let out a scream... just like a little girl. But down the hall he heard his daughter's little laugh. "Gotcha!"

In honor of Alton's daughter and all small children, we offer the following recipe from the Food Network.

Crispy Chicken Fingers Serves 6

Ingredients:

1 1/2 pounds boneless skinless chicken breasts

- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper
- 4 large eggs
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 cups panko breadcrumbs

Honey mustard, spicy ketchup and/or ranch dressing, for serving

Directions:

- 1. Cut the chicken lengthwise into 3/4-inch-wide strips. Put the flour in a shallow dish. Whisk the milk, cayenne, eggs and a pinch of salt and pepper in another shallow dish until combined. Put the breadcrumbs in a third shallow dish.
- Dredge the chicken fingers in the flour, shaking off the excess, then dip into the egg 2. mixture, and finally coat with the panko breadcrumbs, pressing to help adhere well. Set aside on a piece of wax paper or a baking sheet.
- 3. Heat about 1/2 inch of oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Working in batches, fry the chicken fingers, turning occasionally, until golden brown and cooked through, about 3 minutes. Transfer the chicken fingers to a paper towel lined plate to drain and season with salt. Serve with honey mustard, spicy ketchup and/or ranch dressing for dipping.


The October 14 Solar Eclipse by Daniel Peter Joyce "Jedi Dan," Seminole Pl. NW

by Daniel Peter Joyce "Jedi Dan," Seminole Pl. NW The annular (or "Ring") eclipse of the sun on October 14 will be partial, with a bit less than 50% obscuration, from here. Its annularity is visible only in a few western states. First contact here is at 10:36am, mideclipse at 11:58am and ends at 1:19pm. Only a modest amount of darkening will be discernable even at maximum. Direct viewing of the event is inadvisable as there is danger of vision loss. Though the moon will be hiding enough of the sun's glare to mute the normal reflex to look away from a noon-time sun, there are still enough infrared rays coming through to cause harm.

Properly filtered items such as eclipse glasses may be used. Protection with a well-crafted telescope can enable many to look safely at the event. A surprising method is to look at images coming though tree leaves, with each gap acting as a pinhole. This means that kitchen colanders can work the same way, safely protecting the eyes. Use of a well-crafted telescope for protection is the best method as it can reveal such solar features as sunspots. Since 1908 these dark regions on the sun have been recognized as giant magnetic storms often larger than Earth. The magnetic character of the sun as a whole has been linked to historic changes in the Earth's climate.

A much more dramatic event will be happening on April 8, 2024. Mark your calendars as a total solar eclipse will be occurring in the early afternoon. Its path of totality will come as close as Indianapolis, less than a fivehour drive from here. Though 90% of the sun's surface will be blocked by the moon here it would be comparable to being at the Grand Canyon on a foggy day – you are not seeing the real show.

Being in the path of totality, witnessing midday darkness and the inexplicable splendor of the solar atmosphere is an incomparable experience.
