There is no charge for the decal. All watercraft not registered to your Candlewick Lake address in 2023 must be inspected by Public Safety before it goes on the lake. All motorized watercrafts are required to be registered, have a new decal displayed every year, and have the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL displayed on both sides of the watercraft.

Guest watercraft are not allowed.

Canoes, Kayaks and other Non-Motorized Watercraft

Non-motorized watercraft that are not required to be registered with the State, must display the member's unit and lot number preceded by CWL on both sides of the watercraft. You do not need to register non-motorized watercraft at the office. Candlewick decals are not required for non-motorized watercraft.







### From the Table - Just a Bite

#### It's October! Time for the Great Pumpkin!

Pumpkins are native to Central America, but now grow on all continents except Antarctica. They have played a significant role in North America to the extent that we have designated several days this month to celebrate them and their history.

Oct. 1-Pumpkin Spice Day Oct. 4-Pumpkin Seed Day (pepitas)

The 2nd Monday in Oct. - Indigenous People Day - Native Americans taught the Pilgrims their method of planting corn, beans and pumpkins together; what they call "the three sisters." Oct. 26- Pumpkin Day Oct. 31- Halloween & Jack-O-Lanterns

#### Did you know?

- Illinois is the top spot in the U.S. for growing pumpkins. This is due to our soil and climate.
- Although referred to as a vegetable, pumpkins are actually a fruit. (Scientifically speaking, anything that starts out as a flower is a fruit)
- Pumpkins grow on vines that can grow up to 30 feet long. Taproots on pumpkins grow 2-3 feet deep.
- Every part of a pumpkin is edible: the root, stem, leaves, fruit and seeds.
- It takes 90-120 days to grow.
- 80% of U.S. pumpkin crops are available in October.
- Most pumpkins are grown for processing into canned pumpkin.
- Morton, IL Processes 80% of the world's canned pumpkin and so is considered "The Pumpkin Capital of the World".
- Depending on the variety, pumpkins can range from under a pound to over 2000 lbs.
- A pumpkin weighing 1,760 lbs. was grown in Wheaton, IL in 2022. It was planted in April and by June it grew 40 lbs a day, taking 150 gallons of water every 24 hours.
- The largest pumpkin grown in Illinois was in 2015. It weighed 2,145.5 lbs and stood 5
- The biggest pumpkin grown in the U.S., so far, was in Minnesota on Oct 11, 2023. It weighed 2,749 lbs- the same weight as a hippopotamus!
- The largest pumpkin pie was baked in New Bremen, Ohio. It weighed 3,699 lbs. and was 20 ft. in diameter.
- Pumpkin pie recipes back in colonial days were not like todays. Colonists would cut the tops off the pumpkins, remove the seeds and fill the pumpkin with milk, spices and honey; then bake them in hot ashes.

Here are a couple of modern day pumpkin recipes I hope you will enjoy.

#### **Spicy Pumpkin Carrot Soup**

This luscious spicy pumpkin carrot soup is warming, creamy, and packed with health benefits. Plus, it's vegan, budget-friendly, glutenfree, and it's on the table in 25 minutes.

#### **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp olive oil

1 medium yellow onion, chopped

2 garlic cloves, sliced 1 tsp curry powder

1 tsp ground turmeric

1/4 tsp chili flakes, plus more to serve

1/2 lb. carrots, cut into chunks

3 cups low salt vegetable broth

1/3 cup coconut milk

1/2 tsp fine salt

1/8 tsp ground black pepper

1 lb pumpkin (or butternut squash), peeled, seeded, and cut into chunks **Instructions:** 

### Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Once the oil is simmering, add onion and cook for about 5 minutes until the onion starts to soften.

- Then add garlic, turmeric, curry powder, chili flakes, and stir for about 1 minute.
- Add pumpkin, carrots, salt, pepper, and give a good stir.
- 4. Add broth, coconut milk, and bring to a boil.
- Reduce the heat and simmer for about 15 minutes or until the carrot and the pumpkin are cooked through and soft. Stir occasionally.
- Turn off the heat and let it cool slightly. Working in batches, transfer the contents to a blender (do not fill your blender past the maximum fill line and be careful with the hot soup!) and purée the mixture until smooth. Alternately, you can use an emersion blender.
- Taste and season with additional salt and pepper if necessary
- Ladle soup into individual bowls. Top the soup with toasted pumpkin seeds, crusty bread or croutons, and extra chili flakes if you like.

Note: This tends to be on the thick side for me, so I add additional broth to get the consis-

### Pumpkin Pistachio Cream Cannoli

Serves 4

**Ingredients:** 4 oz. mascarpone or plain cream cheese

3/4 cup canned pumpkin

1/2 cup ricotta cheese

3/4 cup powdered sugar

1/2 cup chopped roasted pistachio nuts 1/2 cup whipped cream

12 purchased cannoli shells powdered sugar for dusting

#### 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice **Instructions:**

- 1. In a large bowl stir together Mascarpone (or Cream Cheese), the ¾ cup powdered sugar, pumpkin, ricotta, and pumpkin pie spice until smooth. Stir in 1/4 cup of the nuts,
- 2. In a chilled medium mixing bowl, beat whipping cream until stiff peaks form; fold into the pumpkin mixture. If desired, cover and chill up to 4 hours.
- Shortly before serving, spoon pumpkin mixture into a re-sealable bag. Cut a ¾-inch hole in one corner of the bag. Pipe pumpkin mixture into the cannoli shells, filling shells so pumpkin mixture is exposed on ends. Sprinkle ends of each cannoli with the remaining 1/4 cup of nuts. Arrange on platter and sprinkle with additional powdered

Note: Shells will soften once filled so don't fill shells too early. You want the shells to be crisp, in contrast to the smooth, soft filling.
