CWL Garden Club Learned All About Seed Saving

Our Candlewick Garden Club held their monthly meeting this past August 10, and the presentation was about the art of saving seeds for both flowers and vegetables. The meeting was well attended with over 17 green-thumbed ladies gathered to hear Master Gardeners Jennifer Crider and Bobbi Burke reveal the secrets of how to recover seeds in the fall to be replanted in the spring.

The meeting started off with a Q&A session with discussion of how to turn all the produce being grown in local gardens into funds for the club. Ideas such as having a produce stand in the parking lot of the Admin

office were kicked around, but when it's open to the public, all these licensing things come into play, so we'll see how that goes.

The talk given by the ladies was quite informative as the subjects of how to plant at the best time, which plants were annuals, which need to be replanted every year, and perennials which return on their own, and which plants rely on germination via bees or other little critters. Bobbi urged the audience to save those little silica packets that arrive in the bottom of pills or medication that need to stay dry since certain seeds needed to be completely dry during storage. And then there were other seeds that should be stored in a zip-loc bag with a few drops of water, preferably in the sunshine. A whole lot of information to be digested, but I knew I was WAY over my head when they started talking about male and female plants. I had NO idea...

The club has many events planned for the rest of the season including a Farm Stroll, and later in October, there is to be a speaker who will tell us the ins and outs of managing bees, and it should be very interesting. I'll be there so long as I don't get stung... Come join us!





From the Table - Just a Bite

There's more to chickens than Chicken Wings & Buffalo sauce...

A couple I know were Truck Farmers. They raised flowers, vegetables, chickens and tended bee hives. They sold what they grew at farmer's markets, vegetables, honey and eggs. Over the years I helped them out by tending their farm and "critters", when they needed an extra hand.

I worked at a nursery during summer vacations when I was in college, so I knew how to care for the plants, and I learned not to wear black clothing around the bee hives so bees wouldn't mistake me for a bear on the prowl for their honey; but the chickens? That was a whole new ball game for me.

They had a good-sized flock of hens and two roosters- Bing & Bob. Prior to helping my friends out, all I knew about chickens was they laid eggs and I preferred dark meat to light.

This is what I learned once I started tending Bing, Bob, and their flock. Oh, and a few facts I gathered from other sources along the way.

The first domesticated ancestors of modern day chickens date back 10,000 years in South Asia. They spread globally very rapidly, but not because of their eggs and meat. It was because of cockfighting! The food factor came later. There are more chickens on earth than people and they are EVERYWHERE.

During the 1800's, keeping chickens became very popular in Europe mainly because Queen Victoria kept chickens which she received as a gift. They were three times the size of today's chickens and laid gigantic eggs. Once the Queen kept chickens, her subjects followed suit. (A little trivia here: Exotic chickens were coveted at that time and could cost nearly \$10,000 per bird in today's money. Also, in 1845, the first Poultry Show was held in London. Queen Victoria entered her chickens and Charles Darwin entered his pigeons.)

Just as cats and dogs have been bred for specific characteristics, chickens are also bred for specific traits such as temperament, climate tolerance, appearance, and egg production. (When chickens are well cared for, some varieties lay 280-370 eggs a year.) Chickens lay eggs in a variety of colors as well. Did you know that chickens have ear lobes? They can be blue, red or white. In some cases you can tell the color of a chicken's eggs by the color of its ear lobes.

When it's time to lay an egg, the hen hops into a nesting box, fluffs up the shavings and sits and waits. She may growl at other hens that come too close to her favorite box, and believe it or not, once she lays her egg, "she sings a song" to announce the arrival. (Yes, what you see in all those Disney cartoons is true.) They sing Buk, Buk, Buk...Bagaw! The singing lasts for minutes and sometimes hens that haven't even laid their egg yet will join in.

Once it's laid, the egg and even the hatched chick becomes a community affair. Other hens or even roosters have been known to help sit on eggs in the mother's absence and even help rear the chicks by showing them around, protecting them from danger and teaching them the way of life in the flock.

Given a name, some chickens learn to know their name and respond when called. (Bing & Bob did.)

Chickens have their own routines but can be trained. They can be good pets and they are even used in pet therapy. Who Knew??

Below are two recipes; one, using basically eggs and one for those who continue to be carnivores even after reading this article. Enjoy!

Julia Child's All Purpose Quiche

The best part of a quiche is that while you can make it totally from scratch, it is a terrific way to use up leftovers. Just take whatever bits of meat, cheese or vegetables from your refrigerator and throw it in your quiche. Use the ingredients you love and make this dish your own.

Instructions:

Pie Shells

You may make your own favorite pie crust or buy them frozen. To keep the crust from becoming soggy, it's best to par cook the pie shell a bit, before filling it. If using store bought frozen pie shell, follow the thawing and par baking instructions on the package. Bake until it firms up a bit and no longer looks raw. Remove from the oven and let cool while you prepare the filling.

Heavy cream as needed

1 tablespoon cold butter

9" pie shell (regular size not deep dish)

The Filling

If you are using precooked leftovers, cut them into bite size pieces and put them aside until you are ready to assemble the quiche. If you are starting from scratch, sauté or par cook your choices until tender. Let them cool a bit.

You are ready to assemble

Place the par baked pie crust/pan, on a baking sheet. Spread about 3/4 cup of the shredded cheese over the bottom of the crust. Next, take your 4 cup measuring cup and break the eggs into the cup and whisk. Add your 1 1/2 cups filling to the egg mixture. Stir together. Add salt and pepper to taste. Add enough of the cream to the mixture to bring the measure up to 2 cups.

Pour the mixture into the prepared crust. Sprinkle the remaining ½ cup of cheese over the top of the mixture. Cut the butter into small cubes and dot the top of the quiche with the butter cubes.

Place the baking sheet with the quiche into the oven that has been preheated to 375F and bake for 30-35 minutes until puffed up and golden. (Time may vary with your oven.) As it cools, the quiche will settle back into the pan.

This is just the basic recipe. You may modify the recipe to whatever your taste dictates: all meat, veggies only, blends of cheeses. If you are going crust less, I would lightly grease the pie pan. Then add the first portion of cheese to the egg mixture along with whatever other ingredients you want to add. Mix gently and then pour it all into the greased pie pan. Sprinkle the last bit of cheese over the top. Follow with the butter and bake.

In keeping with the French cooking theme, here is a recipe for those with a more carnivorous taste. According to the innkeeper who shared this recipe with me, the only reason he calls this recipe French Chicken is because the person who shared it with him is French. C'est la vie!

French Chicken

Serves 4

Ingredients:

2 boneless, skinless chicken breastspounded to 1/4 inch thickness

1/4 cup flour

Salt, pepper & garlic powder to taste 2 tablespoons olive oil or canola oil

2 large tomatoes-seeded, peeled-and diced

4 oz. sliced fresh mushrooms

1/2 cup heavy cream

1/2 cup mozzarella cheese

Instructions:

- 1. Flour the chicken and place it in heated oil in a frying pan; season with salt, pepper and garlic powder, Brown the chicken on both sides.
- 2. Top the chicken with the tomatoes and mushrooms.
- 3. Pour heavy cream over the top and sprinkle with a bit more salt, pepper and garlic powder.
- 4. Cover and simmer 15 minutes or place in preheated 350F oven for 20 minutes.
- 5. Uncover and sprinkle the cheese over the top.
- 6. Cover and simmer or bake an additional 5 minutes.

This is great served with Rice Pilaf!
